DSU Takes on Winston-Salem State in Final Road Game of '09

The Delaware State Hornets hit the road for the final time this season, traveling to Winston-Salem, N.C., to take on the Winston-Salem State Rams on Saturday, Nov. 7. Game time is 1 p.m. DSU enters this weekend's game looking to snap a current two-game, road-losing skid. The Hornets are coming off a tough 52-10 loss at No. 10 South Carolina last weekend. The Bulldogs tallied 513 yards of total offense, handing the Hornets their worst conference loss since a 50-8 defeat at the hands of Bethune-Cookman during the 1998 season (Oct. 10, 1998).

Saturday marks the ninth meeting all-time between DSU and WSSU and only the third meeting in the last 50 years between the two squads. Delaware State and Winston-Salem State began playing each other in 1942 and continued to square off until 1950. The two teams renewed the series in 2007 with each team winning on the other's home field. Last season WSSU downed the Hornets 27-26 during the Hornets' final home game of the 2008 season (Nov. 8, 2008). Delaware State looks to avenge last year's one-point loss as the Hornets try to improve their record at Bowman Gray Stadium (1-0).

DSU comes into this weekend's contest averaging 254.57 yards of total offense (No. 106 in the nation) and 15.43 points-per-game (No. 101 nationally). Delaware State gained 225 yards of total offense and was held to 10 points versus the Bulldogs last weekend. Defensively, the Hornets are allowing 438.00 yards-per-game of total offense (No. 113 in the nation) and are allowing 28.57 points-per-game (No. 87 in the nation). DSU's defense allowed 513 yards of total offense, including 316 yards through the air as SCSU put up 52 points versus the Hornets.

The Hornet offense is led by quarterback **Anthony Glaud**, who will be making his seventh start this Saturday. Glaud comes into this week's game averaging 132.7 yards of offense through the air. Completing 57.8 percent of his passes this season (89-of-154), the Sicklerville, N.J., native has tallied 786 passing yards and a pass efficiency rating of 103.29. Glaud completed 8-of-15 passes for 68 yards and one interception versus South Carolina State.

Jaashawn Jones is looking to make his third-career start on Saturday. Jones enters this week's game as the Hornets' leading rusher, gaining 242 yards on 56 carries. Jones is second on the team (behind Glaud) with two rushing touchdowns. Joining Jones in the backfield will be freshman **James Rosseau**. Rosseau comes into the WSSU game with 70 yards on 15 carries. The Philadelphia, Pa., native is coming off his best game to date, rushing for 50 yards on 10 carries versus the Bulldogs.

Sophomore **Darius Jackson** leads all DSU receivers, recording 29 catches for 324 yards this season. The Quincy, Fla., native is averaging 11.2 yards-per-catch and 46.3 yards-per-game. Jackson is No. 4 in the conference in receptions-per-game (4.14) and ranks No. 8 in the MEAC in reception yards-per-game. **Larrone Moore** grabbed four passes for 30 yards last weekend to increase his season total to 21. The Hyattsville, Md., native is second on Hornet roster in receptions (21), registering 191 yards on the season. Moore is also a threat on special teams, averaging 26.6 yards-per-kick return (No. 15 in the nation). Moore is coming off a record day, notching 210 yards on six kick returns, including a 90-yard return for a touchdown versus the Bulldogs. The 90-yard return was the fourth-longest in DSU history.

Nick Lochner continues to be one of the top punters in the MEAC, averaging 40.0 yards-per-punt. The Webster, N.Y., native booted four punts for 180 yards, including two for 50 yards-or-more versus SCSU. Lochner currently ranks No. 3 in career punting average (39.5), No. 8 in career punting yards (3,749) and No. 10 in career punting attempts (95) in the DSU record books.

Defensively, the Hornets are led by defensive tackle **Andre Caroll**, who enters this week's game with 44 total tackles (22 solo). Caroll also leads the team with five tackles for loss. The Neptune, N.J., native recorded six tackles versus the Bulldogs and has had six-or-more tackles in each of the team's last four games. DSU has recorded 12 sacks this season. **Mike Gable** is among the team leaders in sacks (2.0). The DSU linebacker has registered 39 tackles (22 solo) this season, including four tackles for loss. Gable tallied six tackles (5 solo), including a sack last weekend. Safety **Jerome Strums** comes into Saturday's game with 36 total tackles (13 solo) and two interceptions. The Hornet secondary has picked off eight passes this season, returning three for a touchdown.

A Quick Look at Winston-Salem State

Winston Salem State enters this week's contest riding a five-game, home-losing skid, dating back to last season. The Rams are coming off a 16-13 overtime loss to Hampton last Saturday. WSSU is averaging 209.4 yards of total offense-per-game and 10.75 points-per-game. The Rams' defense is allowing 304.5 yards of total offense-per-game and 21.75 points per-game. Winston-Salem State has not scored more than 16 points in any of its first eight games this season.



The Rams are led by quarterback **Jarrett Dunston**, who enters this weekend's game with an 89.82 pass efficiency rating this season. Dunston has completed 40.0 percent of his passes (46-of-115) for 557 yards and five touchdowns.

Dunston's top target is **Omar Kizzie**, who enters Saturday's game with 15 catches for 147 yards. Kizzie averages 18.4 yards-per-game and 9.8 yards-per-reception. **Lamar Whidbee** is also another popular target recording 12 catches for 155 yards this season.

In the backfield, **Cedrick Hickman** is WSSU's top rusher. Hickman has recorded 262 yards on 63 carries and two touchdowns. Hickman is averaging 4.2 yards-per-carry and 367.4 yards-per-game.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Rams are led by **Akeem Ward**, who has tallied 51 total tackles (39 solo), including seven and one-half tackles for loss and two sacks. **Cedrick Marshall** is second on the team in tackles with 45 (23 solo). **Wayne Noble** rounds out the Rams' top tacklers recording 40 tackles (24 solo) on the season. Noble has also registered one of the team's two interceptions this season.

The Last Meeting

Winston-Salem State scored the game-winning touchdown with less than five minutes to play, then stopped Delaware State on fourth down and a foot on the Hornets' final possession in a 27-26 victory at Alumni Stadium. The Rams won their second in a row to improve to 3-6 on the season, while the Hornets fell to 3-6 after dropping their third straight. Winston-Salem State trailed 26-14 before outscoring DSU 13-0 over the last 21 minutes of the game.

The Rams trailed 26-21 before quarterback **Jarrett Dunston** capped off a 12-play, 56-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge on fourth-down to give WSSU a 27-26 lead with 4:19 left to play. A two-point pass following the touchdown was unsuccessful. On the ensuing possession, Delaware State drove 52 yards to the Rams' 20-yard line. The drive was aided by a pass interference call on Winston-Salem State with the Hornets facing a third-down-and-22 on their 16-yard line.

Kareem Jones also had a 29-yard run during the drive. Delaware State faced a fourth-down and less-than-a-yard at the Winston-Salem 20 with 38 seconds left, but Vashon Winton was stopped short on a quarterback keeper up the middle, setting off a celebration on the Rams' sideline.

Delaware State opened the scoring on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Winston to Kareem Jones on the game's first possession. The big play in the drive was a 45-yard pass from Winton to **Larrone Moore** to the Winston-Salem 19. Jones also rushed for 21 yards during the drive, part of his career-best 230 yards in the game, the fifth-highest total in team history.

Winston-Salem scored 14 unanswered points, including touchdown runs by Willie Wilson (four yards) and Dunston (eight yards) to open up a 14-7 lead in the first quarter. A 27-yard field goal by **Riley Flickinger** and a safety on a bad punt snap by the Rams pulled Delaware State to within 14-12 with 9:49 left in the second quarter. The Hornets regained the lead when Winton connected with **Erick Jones** on a nine-yard touchdown pass with 6:33 left in the second quarter. The extra point by Flickinger gave DSU a 19-14 lead. Delaware State stretched its lead to 26-14 when Winton and Moore teamed up on a 14-yard scoring pass with 32 seconds left in the first half.

Winston-Salem State pulled to within 26-21 on a nine-yard touchdown run by Nicholas Copper with 6:10 left in the third quarter.

Delaware State - Winston-Salem State History

- ▶ Saturday's contest will mark ninth meeting between DSU and WSSU.
- ▶ The Hornets and Rams have split their last two meetings.
- ▶ **Head Coach Al Lavan** owns a 1-1 record all-time versus Winston-Salem State.
- ▶ Prior to the 2007 season, DSU and WSSU have not met since the 1950 season.
- ▶ DSU has never shut out the Rams. The Rams shut out the Hornets, 18-0, during the 1950 season.
- ▶ The last two outings between DSU and WSSU have been decided by three points or less.
- ▶ Winston-Salem State has never won two-straight games over Delaware State.

A Delaware State Win Would...

- ▶ Give the Hornets their second road win of the season.

'Moore' All-Purpose Yards Than Anyone Else in 2009

Larrone Moore registered a season-high 240 all-purpose yards versus the South Carolina State Bulldogs (Oct. 31). The 240 yards tied **Phil Anderson** (Nov. 12, 1994) for the seventh-most in a single game in DSU history. The Hyattsville, Md., native returned six kicks for 210 yards and caught four passes for 30 yards versus the Bulldogs.

More on Moore

Larrone Moore recorded the fourth-longest kick return in Delaware State history with a 90-yard return for a touchdown during the Hornets' game at South Carolina State (Oct. 31). Moore became the fourth player in Delaware State to register a return of 90 yards-or-more and became the first to return a kickoff for a touchdown since **Brandon Hudson** did it versus North Carolina A&T (10/13/07).

DSU Suffers Bad Loss at S.C. State

The South Carolina State Bulldogs racked up 513 yards of total offense versus the Delaware State Hornets on Saturday, Oct. 31. The Bulldogs scored 52 points and handed DSU its worse conference loss since a 50-8 loss to Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 10, 1998.

Hornets Win Fifth-Straight Homecoming Contest

With DSU's 35-22 win over Morgan State on Saturday, Oct. 24, the Hornets have now won five-straight homecoming contests. Delaware State's last homecoming loss came at hands of South Carolina State on Oct. 30, 2004 (28-14). During the Hornets win streak, DSU has outscored its opponents, 180-81, including two games of 40 points-or-more.

Running Backs Running Thin

The Hornets enter this week's game with a depleted running back corps. Following an injury to true freshman **Nick Williams** (vs. Morgan State - Oct. 24), DSU is down to one running back on scholarship. This week's two-deep lists redshirt sophomore **Jaashawn Jones** ahead of walk-on **James Rosseau**.

DSU's starting running back **Jason Randall** entering the season went down with a knee injury during the Hornets' game at Hampton (Sept. 26). Redshirt sophomore Tahree McQueen stepped in and replaced Randall for two games before suffering a season-ending injury at Michigan (Oct. 17). With the injury to McQueen, Williams was called upon and made his first-career start versus Morgan State. During that game Williams went down with an injury and is listed as "out".

60 and Counting

The Delaware State Hornets scored 10 points versus the South Carolina State Bulldogs to extend the team's consecutive games scored streak to 60. The Hornets have not been shut out since a 49-0 loss to Southern Illinois on Sept. 25, 2004.

Grant Named MEAC Defensive Player of the Week

Defensive back Avery Grant was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Defensive Player of the Week for the week ending Oct. 25.



Grant helped lead DSU to its first home victory of the 2009 season, registering seven total tackles and recording his first-career interception versus the Morgan State Bears on Saturday, Oct. 24. The Brooklyn, N.Y., native picked off a pass by Carlton Jackson late in the fourth quarter and returned it 15 yards for a touchdown to seal the Hornets victory. One of the top tacklers on the squad, Grant's seven tackles versus the Bears, tied his season high and improved his 2009 total to 35 tackles.

This is Grant's second-career player of the week honor and first of the 2009 season.

100-Yard Rushers

On Saturday, Oct. 24, **Jaashawn Jones** became the 176th running back at DSU (since 1970) to rush for 100 yards, following a 107-yard performance versus Morgan State. Jones recorded his first-career 10-yard outing on 17 carries with one touchdown.

Earlier this season, **Tahree McQueen** rushed for 102 yards at Hampton (Sept. 26). McQueen broke the century mark on 21 carries for his first-career 100-yard game.

DSU's record for most rushing yards in a game is held by Gene Lake, who registered 336 yards on 33 carries versus Liberty on Nov. 10, 1984.

The Big House Sets DSU Record

On Saturday, Oct. 17, Delaware State took the field at Michigan Stadium in front of a crowd of 106,304. Prior to this outing, the largest crowd to see DSU play was 29,713 on Sept. 2, 2006 when the Hornets took on Florida A&M at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich. Record Return

Travis Tarpley returned the opening kickoff of the DSU/Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 10) game 85 yards to set up the Hornets only touchdown of the game. The return tied the school record for the sixth longest in DSU history and was the longest return since 2002 season (92-yards return by DaShaun Morris).

Speaking of Top Returners

Junior **Larrone Moore** comes into this week's contest looking to add to his career numbers in kickoff returns. The Hyattsville, Md., native returned six kicks for 210 yards at South Carolina State (Oct. 31) to move into No. 4 in kick returns (41) and into No. 3 in kick return yards (934) in the DSU record books. Moore has returned 41 kicks for 934 yards and a 22.8 yards-per-return average during his DSU career.

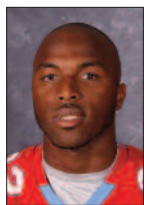

Block Party

The first was a 36-yard attempt during DSU's 21-12 loss at Florida A&M (Sept. 5) and the second was a 33-yard try during the Hornets' 21-6 win at Hampton (Sept. 26).

McQueen and Lochner Earn MEAC Player of the Week Honors

Running back **Tahree McQueen** has been named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Rookie of the Week, while punter **Nick Lochner** earned the league's Special Teams Player of the Week honor for the week ending Sept. 27.



McQueen recorded his first-career 100-yard rushing performance during DSU's 21-6 win at Hampton on Sept. 26. The Paterson, N.J., native carried the ball a career-high 21 times for 102 yards for an average of 4.9 yards-per-game. McQueen also registered a career-best 18-yard rush versus the Pirates in just his third appearance with the Hornets. The 5-foot-10 running back also caught three passes for 25 yards. Both totals were a career-best. On the day, McQueen recorded 127 all-purpose yards.

This is McQueen's first player of the week honor.

Lochner recorded six punts for 264 yards versus the Pirates, pinning Hampton deep in its own territory each time. On the day, Lochner recorded two punts of 50 yards-or-more, including a season-best 60-yard punt. Two of his punts were fair caught and three were inside the 20-yard line as Hampton returned three punts for a total of six yards. Lochner ranks No. 47 in the nation in punting (38.7 yards-per-punt). Lochner also registered



eight yards on the ground. On fourth-&-eight, Lochner took a botched snap and rushed for a first down, keeping DSU's drive going to start the second quarter. The drive resulted in the Hornets' first touchdown of the game.

The honor marks the first of the season for Lochner and the second of his career.

Richmond Named Semifinalist for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy

Senior offensive lineman **Nick Richmond** has been selected as one of 154 semifinalists for the 2009 William V. Campbell Trophy (formerly known as the Draddy Trophy), endowed by HealthSouth, and the candidates for the 2009 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards as announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) this past Thursday (Oct. 1).



Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, semifinalists must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. Renamed this fall in honor of Bill Campbell, the chairman of Intuit, former player and head coach at Columbia University and the 2004 recipient of the NFF's Gold Medal, the award comes with a 25-pound bronze trophy and a \$25,000 post-graduate scholarship.

The NFF Awards Committee will select and announce up to 15 finalists on Oct. 29. Each finalist will be recognized as part of the 2009 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Class, receiving an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. The Campbell Trophy winner, who will have his scholarship increased to \$25,000, will be announced live at the NFF's Annual Awards Dinner on December 8 at the prestigious Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. A total distribution of \$277,000 in scholarships will be awarded that evening.

Launched in 1959, the NFF scholar-athlete program became the first initiative in history to award post-graduate scholarships based on both a player's academic and athletic accomplishments. The William V. Campbell Trophy, first awarded in 1990, adds to the program's mystique, having previously honored two Rhodes Scholars, a Rhodes Scholar finalist and a Heisman winner. The University of California's Alex Mack, a first-round draft pick of the Cleveland Browns, was named the 2008 Campbell Trophy recipient.

Strums Makes His Mark Versus Blue Hens

Redshirt senior **Jerome Strums** etched in the DSU record books with a 71-yard interception return for a touchdown on Saturday, Sept. 19 at Delaware Stadium. The interception was his first of the season and the first-ever return for a touchdown by the Windsor, Conn., native. It also became the fifth-longest interception return in Delaware State history. It also marked only the fifth time in DSU history a player return an interception for 70 yards-or-more.

The pick was the first interception for a touchdown by the Hornets since **Akeem Green** scored on an 86-yard interception versus N.C. A&T on Oct. 13, 2007.

More Additions to the Record Book at Delaware

During DSU's 27-17 loss at Delaware (Sept. 19), two Hornets were added the school's record books while one moved up in the rankings.

Jerome Strums picked off a Pat Devlin pass for 71 yards (fifth-longest in school history). Quarterback **Anthony Glaud** completed 23 passes (fifth-most completions in a single game - tied with Vashon Winton who had 23 versus S.C. State on Nov. 1, 2008).

Lavan Suffers First-Ever Loss to Rattlers

Delaware State's season-opening loss to the Florida A&M Rattlers was the first-ever for Head Coach **Al Lavan**. In his sixth season with the Hornets, Lavan entered the 2009 season with a perfect 4-0 record versus the team from Tallahassee. In the first four meetings with the Rattlers, Lavan's squads averaged 25.0 points-per-game with an average margin of victory of eight points. This year's contest marked the first time a Lavan-coached team had not scored 20-or-more points versus FAMU (12). The loss also snapped DSU's longest winning streak versus FAMU (4).

Double-Digit Tackles

Through the team's first six games, four Hornets have recorded 10-or-more tackles in a single contest. Defensive back **Jerome Strums** holds the season-high for the DSU after registering 12 tackles versus Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 10). For his career Strums has recorded 82 total tackles. The school record for tackles in a single game is 23 held by **Craig Parsley** (vs. Howard on Nov. 18, 1989). Parsley finished his DSU career with 233 tackles (No. 8 all-time at DSU).

Nick Richmond Nominated for Allstate/ACFA Good Works Team®

Center **Nick Richmond** has been nominated for the Allstate / AFCA Good Works Team® as announced on July 23. A total of 106 nominations submitted by sports information directors across the country on behalf of their teams surpasses all previous single-season nominee totals in the 18-year history of the award. The 2009 class of nominees represents 41 states, including Washington, D.C., and 45 college athletic conferences.

A hard-working and committed group of college football players will take the field this fall knowing that the impact they have on their teams and communities has nothing to do with touchdowns, tackles or receptions.

Richmond, who is entering his final year with Hornets, has been the starting center for Delaware State over the past four years. He is a 2008-09 MEAC All-Academic honoree and anchored an offensive line that averaged 136.45 yards-per-game on the ground and 167.64 yards-per-game through the air last season. The DSU offensive line ranked second in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference in sacks allowed (1.82 sacks-per-game). Nick has been nominated for his work with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). Some of his work with the community includes, mentoring and serving as a role model for kids at the Stevenson House Detention Center (Milford, Del.). The Lampeter, Pa., native also assists the community in fundraisers, luncheons and prayer groups. Richmond is also a regular participant in visits to local elementary schools.

For his charitable work, Richmond is one of 55 nominees in the "Combined Divisions (FCS, II, III & NAIA)" for this year's team honor.

Two New Coaches on 2009 Staff

Two new assistant coaches have joined **Al Lavan's** staff - offensive line coach **Adam Shorter** and cornerback's coach **Ronald Bolton**.

► **Adam Shorter, Offensive Line Coach** - Shorter is in his first season with the Hornets. He came to DSU after a one-year stint at Alcorn State, where he was in charge of the offensive line and tight ends.

While with the Braves, Shorter was instrumental in the success of 2008 All-Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) offensive lineman Bronson Carvalho. His administrative duties included development of game plans and recruiting profiles. He also coordinated the university's Letterman's Golf Outing and Captains Breakfast.

Shorter began his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the University of Cincinnati (2005-2007). There he assisted in various areas of scouting, including film break down and weekly opponent scouting reports for the offense, defense and special teams.

In 2006, Shorter was promoted to interim offensive line coach. He helped lead the Bearcats to an 8-5 record and an appearance in the inaugural International Bowl in Toronto, Canada. That year, UC recorded 1,737 yards on the ground and 11 rushing touchdowns. The 2007 Bearcats were 10-3 and appeared in the Papa Johns Bowl. Cincy was ranked 17th in the final Associated Press poll.

Shorter was a four-year letterman at Cincinnati, where he was the team's starting center. He was the recipient of the John Pease Award as the Bearcats' most outstanding offensive lineman as a senior. Shorter appeared in three of Cincinnati's four bowl appearances during his tenure. He competed in the 2001 Motor City Bowl, was a member of the 2002 Conference USA Championship squad that played in the New Orleans Bowl and wrapped up his senior year in the Fort Worth Bowl.

While at Cincinnati, Shorter was coached by former Miami Dolphins center and Dan Marino teammate Jeff Ulenhank and current Pittsburgh Steelers offensive line coach Larry Zierlein.

He earned a bachelor's degree in integrated social studies in secondary education from

Cincinnati in 2004.

A native of Indianapolis, Ind., Shorter and wife Michelle reside in Dover.

► **Ronald Bolton, Cornerback's Coach** - The Petersburg, Va., native is in his first season on the Delaware State staff. He brings experience as a professional player, collegiate player and coach, and high school coach to the Hornets.

After a standout college career at Norfolk State, where he was a Pittsburgh Courier Gazette Black College All-America, Bolton was selected by National Football League's New England Patriots in the fifth round of the 1972 draft. During his four seasons as a cornerback with Patriots, he served two years as the team's Player Representative.

From 1976 to '82, Bolton was a member of the NFL's Cleveland Browns. He helped lead the Browns to the AFC Central Division championship and playoff berth in 1980.

Bolton's college coaching experience includes stints at Howard University (2002-06), Norfolk State University (1997-2001) and Liberty University (1996-97).

While at Howard, Bolton served as defensive backs coach and special teams coordinator under current Delaware State defensive coordinator Ray Petty, who was head coach of the Bison from 2002 to '06. Howard was No. 1 in the MEAC in total defense in 2005 and No. 2 in '06.

Bolton was also position coach for three Howard players currently in the National Football League. Antoine Bethea (Indianapolis Colts), Ronald Bartell (St. Louis Rams) and Geoff Pope (Cincinnati Bengals) each benefitted from Bolton's tutelage while playing for the Bison.

Bolton was defensive backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Norfolk State and defensive backs coach at Liberty.

During the 2007 and '08 seasons, he was a teacher and head football coach at Booker T. Washington High School in Norfolk, Virginia.

Bolton earned a bachelor's in Health and Physical Education from Norfolk State in 1972.

Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan

Al Lavan (Colorado State, '68) enters his sixth season at the helm of the Delaware State Hornets looking to claim his second league championship in the past three years (2007 champion). One year removed from the school's sixth MEAC title, the Hornets recorded the team's first losing season (5-6) since Lavan's first year but, registered their fifth-straight winning conference record (5-3). With the 2008 conference record of 5-3, the Hornets' head coach has never had a losing record in MEAC play.

In five seasons at DSU, Lavan has posted an overall record of 34-22, including a 29-10 mark in MEAC contests. He has led the team to winning records in three of the last four seasons. In the three years prior to his arrival, the Hornets were 10-24 overall and 6-17 in the league. Delaware State had just one winning season in the eight years before Lavan took the job. Lavan is ranked No. 3 all-time for most coaching victories at DSU (34).

Entering the 2009 season, Lavan has a 36-23 career record as a head coach, including a 2-1 mark during an interim stint at Eastern Michigan in 2003.

Prior to accepting the Delaware State position, Lavan served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Eastern Michigan University. He was promoted to assistant head coach for the 2003 football season, and upon the late-season firing of then-head coach Jeff Woodruff, Lavan was named interim head coach. After he took over the 1-8 team, Eastern Michigan won two of its final three games.

In more than 18 years as a NFL assistant, Lavan's resume' includes stints with the Atlanta Falcons, Dallas Cowboys,

San Francisco 49ers, Baltimore Ravens, and the Kansas City Chiefs.

He was a member of George Seifert's 1990 Super Bowl champion San Francisco 49ers' coaching staff. That team included former Delaware State University standout John Taylor, who caught a touchdown pass in the 49ers' 55-10 win over the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXIV.

In Dallas, Lavan worked under Hall of Fame head coach Tom Landry. He helped Cowboy running backs Tony Dorsett and Herschel Walker combine for six 1000-yard seasons.

Lavan has also served as position coach for NFL all stars Roger Craig, Priest Holmes, Tom Rathman, Ernest Byner, Robert Newhouse and Bam Morris.

Lavan's collegiate coaching tenure includes stops at Colorado State, Louisville, Iowa State, Georgia Tech, Stanford, and Washington.

He helped guide Georgia Tech to the 1978 Peach Bowl, and Washington to the 1993 Rose Bowl and 1995 Sun Bowl.

While under Lavan at Washington, Napoleon Kaufman rushed for a then-school record 1,390 yards in 1994 and had 1,851 all-purpose yards in 1993. He played seven NFL seasons before retiring in 2001.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (September 5, 2009) --- Preseason All-MEAC quarterback Curtis Pulley rushed for 196 yards and a touchdown, and passed for 140 yards to lead Florida A&M to a 21-12 win over Delaware State before 17,209 fans at steamy Bragg Stadium in the season opener for both teams Saturday evening. The Rattlers snapped a four-game losing streak in the series, notching their first win over the Hornets since a 15-14 victory in Tallahassee in 2003. Florida A&M dominated the time of possession 35:28 to 24:32. The Rattlers rushed for 328 yards en route to a 485 to 274 advantage in total yards. Lavan also lost his first MEAC opener in six seasons with the Hornets. Florida A&M scored first when fullback Mykel Benson completed a nine-play, 69-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge with 10:08 left in the second quarter. The more than four minute drive was highlighted by a 31-yard pass completion from quarterback Curtis Pulley to Isaac West to the DSU four-yard line. The Rattlers were also aided by a Delaware State personal foul penalty on a second down at the Hornet 30-yard line. The extra point kick by Trevor Scott gave Florida A&M a 7-0 lead. Delaware State answered the Florida A&M score with one of its own on the ensuing possession. Senior receiver Zacharri Charles capped off the drive with a spectacular 30-yard diving catch of a Glaud pass in the end zone with 6:39 left in the second quarter. The score was the first for Charles and longest in his collegiate career. Earlier in the drive, Glaud connected with Larrone Moore on a 36-yard pass to the Florida A&M 30. The Hornets failed to tie the game after the score when Riley Flickinger missed the extra point kick after holder Nick Lochner bobbed a low snap. Florida A&M added to its lead on the very next possession. The Rattlers needed just six plays to reach the end zone. Four plays after a 36-yard scramble by Pulley to the DSU 18, halfback Lonvontae Page scored on a six-yard run to give FAMU a 14-6 lead with 3:19 left in the second quarter. The Hornets prevented Florida A&M from stretching its lead right before the half when Nail Muradymov blocked a 36-yard field goal attempt by Scott with six seconds left in the second quarter. Florida A&M outgained the Hornets 289 to 140 in the first half. The Rattlers rushed for 178 yards on 27 carries and passed for 111 yards in the first 30 minutes. DSU passed for 72 yards and rushed for 68 in the first half. The Rattlers led 14-6 at the half. Delaware State drove into Florida A&M territory on the opening possession of the second half, but the drive ended when receiver Darius Jackson lost a fumble at the Rattler 35. Four plays after the turnover, Pulley found the end zone on a 47-yard run to give the Rattlers a 21-6 lead with 10:36 left in the third quarter. The Hornets took advantage of a Florida A&M error to cut into the Rattlers' lead. Seven plays after recovering a fumble at the Florida A&M 46, Jason Randall scored his first career touchdown on a four-yard run with 12 minutes left to play. A two-point pass attempt was incomplete, leaving the Hornets with a 21-12 deficit. After another Florida A&M turnover, Delaware State drove to the Rattler 16 but a fumble on the hand off from Glaud to Randall was recovered by FAMU, dashing the Hornets' final hopes. Glaud was 17 for 32 for 188 yards and a touchdown in his first start at quarterback for the Hornets, while Randall rushed for a team high 54 yards. Linebacker Mike Gable led the Hornets with a career-high 11 tackles, including six solo stops.

NEWARK, Del. (September 19, 2009) --- The University of Delaware has claimed First State bragging rights after a 27-17 victory over Delaware State in the first regular season between the state's two Division I football programs before 20,585 fans at Delaware Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 19. The Hens, who improved to 2-1 on the season, were awarded the inaugural First State Cup after the game. The Hornets fell to 0-2 on the season. Delaware took a 7-0 lead following a 1-yard run by Devlin with 7:41 left in the first quarter. The Blue Hens drove 63 yards on 15 plays and ate up 5:42 seconds on the game clock. The Hornets stopped the Blue Hens, forcing UD to attempt a 42-yard field goal. However, a personal foul penalty gave Delaware new life, leading to the game's first score. The Hornets responded with a 42-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger with 5:04 left in the first. A drive which lasted eight plays for 45 yards (2:31) was capped off by Flickinger's career-long conversion. The field goal cut into UD's lead, 7-3. UD had a chance to head into halftime with a seven point lead. With 1.5 seconds on the clock and the ball at the Delaware State 1-yard line, linebacker Kevin Green stopped running back Leon Jackson behind the line of scrimmage. The stop kept the deficit at four points as both teams went into the locker room. Delaware out-gained Delaware State 153-111 in the first half of play. The Hornets held the edge on the ground, gaining 83 yards on 17 carries to UD's 33 yards on 19 rushes. The Blue Hens extended their lead to 14-3 following Devlin's second 1-yard rushing touchdown of the day. Delaware drove 70 yards on four plays in 1:28. The drive was highlighted by a 38-yard completion from Devlin to Tommy Crosby taking the ball down to the DSU 2-yard line. UD added seven points with 10:56 left in the fourth quarter as Devlin connected with Rob Jones for a 17-yard touchdown pass. The TD reception completed a six-play, 59-yard drive which lasted 2:39. The score gave Delaware a 21-3 advantage over Delaware State. The Hens were attempting to pad their lead when the Hornets were given new life thanks to a defensive score. Free safety Jerome Strums intercepted a tipped pass by Devlin, returning it 71 yards for a touchdown to cut Delaware's lead to 21-10 with 5:01 left to play. Delaware dashed any hopes of a Hornet comeback on its next possession. Three plays after a 54-yard return by Jerry Butler on the ensuing kickoff, the Hens added another touchdown to put the game out of reach. Leon Jackson capped off the three-play, 23-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run to give UD a 27-10 lead with 3:36 remaining. Delaware State made the final score more respectable with a touchdown in the final minute. The Hornets moved 74 yards in 10 plays, capped off by a touchdown by quarterback Anthony Glaud on a one-yard keeper with 31 seconds left to play. Glaud completed five-of-six passes for 57 yards during the scoring drive. The Hornets drove into Delaware territory five times in the second half before finally recording an offensive touchdown. Each team racked up 343 total yards. The Hornets passed for 208 yards, while rushing for 135. Delaware threw for 227 yards and rushed for 116. Glaud completed 23 of 40 passes for 208 yards. He threw one interception. Junior Jason Randall rushed for a game and career-high 93 yards on 20 carries. HAMPTON, Va. (September 26, 2009) --- Delaware State intercepted three passes and Tahree McQueen rushed for 102 yards to lead the Hornets to their first win of the season, 21-6, over Hampton in a Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference game at Armstrong Field Saturday evening. The Hornets won their second-straight at Hampton to improve to 1-2 overall and 1-1 in the MEAC. The Pirates fell to 2-2 and 1-1. Delaware State put the game out of reach with a touchdown on its third interception of the game. The Hornets led 14-6 when freshman defensive end Olusegun Ayanbiola picked off a deflected pass by Hampton's Herbert Bynes and returned it 13 yards with 1:10 left to play. The Hornets had three interceptions in a game for the first time since last season at Howard. Senior cornerback Greg Ligon picked off two passes for DSU, the first of his career. McQueen, a transfer from Cincinnati who was playing his third game with the Hornets, set a career-high in rushing yards. He entered the game in the first quarter after starting halfback Jason Randall left the game with a knee injury. After a scoreless first quarter, the Hornets drew first blood on a 15-play, 80-yard drive that consumed more than seven minutes. Quarterback Anthony Glaud capped off the drive with a 13-yard touchdown run with 10:22 left in the second quarter. The key plays in the drive were an eight-yard run by punter Nick Lochner to the DSU 46-yard line after he dropped the snap on a fourth down-and-seven, and a 24-yard pass from Glaud to Darius Jackson to the Hampton 13-yard line. The touchdown run was the second of the year for Glaud, and longest of his career. The extra point kick by Riley Flickinger gave the Hornets a 7-0 lead. Following the Delaware State touchdown drive, Hampton drove 81 yards to the Delaware State 15, but Jordan Stovall's 33-yard field goal attempt was blocked by Nail Muradymov, his second field goal block of the season. The Hornets stretched their lead to 14-0 on a four-yard touchdown pass from Glaud to tight end Calvin Toliver with four seconds left in the half. The touchdown was the first of Toliver's career. The teams combined for 401 yards of total offense in the first half. Delaware State collected 210 yards on 36 plays, while Hampton racked up 191 yards on 27 plays. Glaud completed 12-of-19 passes for 113 yards and touchdown, while Tahree McQueen rushed for 71 yards on 10 carries in the first 30 minutes for the Hornets. Hampton scored its only points of the game on a 52-yard touchdown pass from Bynes to Isiah Thomas to pull to within 14-6 with 7:46 left in the third quarter. The score came one play after Delaware State thought it recovered a Hampton fumble, but the play was nullified due to an inadvertent whistle. Hampton won the total yardage battle, 390-to-277. For the game, Glaud completed 20-of-31 passes for 150 yards and one touchdown. Avery Grant and Mike Gable led the Hornets with six tackles each.

DOVER, Del. (October 10, 2009) --- Freshman Kory Kowalski kicked a 40-yard field goal with 2:12 left to play to lift Bethune-Cookman to its first win of the season, 9-7, over Delaware State in the 2009 home opener for the Hornets at Alumni Stadium. The Wildcats improved to 1-4 overall and 1-3 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), while the Hornets fell to 1-3 and 1-2. Bethune-Cookman also snapped a four-game losing streak against the Hornets, and won at Alumni Stadium for the first time since 2003. Delaware State had one possession after the Kowalski field goal, but back-up quarterback Nick Elko, playing in his first collegiate game, was intercepted by Bethune-Cookman's Michael Williams at the Hornet 35-yard line with 32 seconds left to play. Elko was inserted into the game when DSU starter Anthony Glaud left the game due to injury in the second quarter. Bethune-Cookman drove 29 yards on seven plays to set up Kowalski's game-winning kick. The key play in the drive was a 13-yard pass from Matthew Johnson to Jevaughn Reams to the Delaware State 23. The field goal was just the second of the season for Kowalski, who missed two attempts earlier in the game, including a 37-yarder with 7:22 left in the fourth quarter. The game began on a high note for the Hornets. Redshirt freshman Travis Tarpley returned the opening kickoff 85-yards to the Bethune-Cookman two-yard line. On the first play after the return, Jaashawn Jones rushed for a two-yard touchdown. Riley Flickinger's extra point gave the Hornets a 7-0 lead just 16 seconds into the game. The score held up through the second and third quarters, although each team failed to convert scoring opportunities. Bethune-Cookman lost a fumble inside the Delaware State five-yard-line in the second quarter, while the Hornets missed a field goal attempt in each quarter. Bethune-Cookman finally broke through on the third play of the fourth quarter. Johnson connected with Jameil McCloud on a 46-yard scoring pass to pull the Wildcats to within 7-6 with 14:16 left to play. The play capped off a seven-play, 70-yard drive that consumed two-minutes-53-seconds. Johnson completed three-of-four passes for 67 yards in the drive. The Wildcats failed to tie the game when Delaware State's Greg Ligon blocked Kowalski's extra point kick. Bethune-Cookman dominated the Hornets in nearly every statistical category. The Wildcats outgained the Hornets 350-to-166, and held a 22-minute advantage in time of possession (41:11-18:49). Bethune-Cookman passed for 218 yards, compared to 71 for the Hornets. BCU also won the rushing battle, 132-to-95. Jones led all players with a career-high 71 yards rushing on 13 carries for the Hornets. Zacharri Charles led DSU with three receptions, although he totaled just 10 yards. Larrone Moore had a team-high 28 receiving yards on two catches. Elko completed 5-of-15 passes for 32 yards in his relief role. The redshirt freshman did not see action in the Hornets' first three games. DSU's Jerome Strums led all players with a career-high 12 tackles, including seven solo stops. Francis Adjei had nine tackles and his fourth career interception (27-yard return) in the contest.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (October 17, 2009) --- In front of a crowd of 106,304 the Delaware State Hornets fell to the Michigan Wolverines, 63-6, at the Big House on Saturday, Oct. 17. The Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Div. I-A) Wolverines snapped a two-game losing streak to improve to 5-2 on the season. The Hornets, members of the Football Championship Subdivision (formerly Div. I-AA), dropped their second straight to fall to 1-4. Eight different players scored touchdowns for Michigan, which racked up a school-record 727 yards of total offense. UM's yardage also marked a single-game record by a Delaware State opponent. The Hornets gained 216 yards on the day, 151 through the air and 65 on the ground. The Wolverines took a 7-0 lead following a two-yard run by sophomore Michael Smith with 12:06 left in the first quarter. The five-play, 45-yard drive on Michigan's first possession lasted 1:51. UM stretched its lead to 14-0 when Vincent Smith capped off a seven-play, 72-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown run with 8:12 left in the first quarter. Smith rushed for a game-high 166 yards on 17 carries. Michigan scored on special teams to open up a three-touchdown lead. Brandon Graham returned blocked punt two yards for a touchdown to give the Wolves a 21-0 with 7:07 left in the opening frame. The Wolverines capped off the first quarter scoring with 3:12 left on a 38-yard touchdown pass from Denard Robinson to Kelvin Grady to open up a 28-0 lead. Michigan added 21 second quarter points, including a touchdown run and a scoring pass by Robinson to open up a 49-0 lead. Delaware State got on the scoreboard right before halftime, thanks to a long kickoff return. Larrone Moore returned a Michigan kickoff 51 yards to the Wolverine 23. On the next play, DSU quarterback Nick Elko completed a 19-yard pass to Donnell Dixon to the Michigan 4. The Hornets were unable to advance the ball any further, and had to settle for a 26-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger to pull to within 49-3 with 57 seconds left in the first half. Elko completed 18-of-34 passes for 151 yards in his first collegiate start. The Odenton, Md., native was filling in for Anthony Glaud, who sat out the contest due to an injury suffered in last week's loss to Bethune-Cookman. The Hornets kept Michigan off the scoreboard in the third quarter. The highlight of the quarter was two fourth-down stops for the DSU defense. The Hornets stopped the Wolverines on a fourth down inside the DSU 5, and at the Hornet 18 in the third quarter. Flickinger added his second field goal of the game, a 24-yarder, to make it 49-6 with 11:35 left to play. The highlight of the four-play, 76-yard scoring drive was a 42-yard pass from Elko to Justin Wilson to the Michigan 9. The play was the longest from scrimmage for the Hornets this season. Wilson was tied for the team high with four catches for a game-high 55 yards. Zach Charles also had four receptions (28 yards) for the Hornets. Freshman Nick Williams came off the bench to lead DSU with 48 yards rushing on 10 carries. His total included a 26-yard run in the fourth quarter. Free safety Jerome Strums led the Hornets with 10 tackles (6 solo) to lead all players. Lineman Andre Carroll had seven tackles (all solo), including a backfield stop. Linebacker Kevin Green had six tackles (5 solo), including a forced fumble that was recovered by Greg Ligon in the first quarter.

DOVER, Del. (October 24, 2009) --- Delaware State scored a season-high five touchdowns, including one on defense, in a 35-22 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) win over Morgan State before a homecoming crowd of 5,327 at Alumni Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Hornets snapped a two-game losing streak to improve to 2-5 overall and 2-3 in the MEAC. The loss ended a five-game win streak for the Bears, who fell to 5-2 and 3-1. Delaware State's previous high score this season was 21 in a victory over Hampton (21-6) on Sep. 26. DSU's Jaashawn Jones rushed for a career-high 107 yards on 17 carries, including a four-yard touchdown run, to lead the Hornet offense. Delaware State quarterback Anthony Glaud completed 16 of 26 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns in his return to action after missing last week's loss to Michigan due to an injury. Morgan State opened the scoring when a punt by Delaware State's Nick Lochner was blocked out of the endzone for a safety with 7:37 left in the first quarter. The Bears stretched their lead to 5-0 when true freshman Kemar Scarlett tied a MEAC record with a 55-yard field goal with 4:44 left in the opening quarter. Delaware State ended an eight-quarter touchdown drought, and pulled ahead in the game, when Glaud reached the endzone on a four-yard quarterback keeper early in the second quarter. The key play in the 48-yard drive was a 23-yard pass from Glaud to Darius Jackson to the Morgan State 15. Riley Flickinger's extra point gave the Hornets a 7-5 lead with 9:53 left in the second quarter. The Hornets opened up a 14-5 lead when Jones added a four-yard touchdown run with 5:22 left in the second quarter. Jones had a career-high 34-yard run to the Morgan State 11 in the drive. Morgan State answered with a 10-play, 68-yard touchdown drive with less than a minute to go in the second quarter. The drive was capped off by a 23-yard touchdown pass from Carlton Jackson to Winfred Digs to pull the Bears to within 14-12 with 44 seconds left in the half. Delaware State responded with a touchdown of its own in the final seconds of the half. Glaud connected with Donnell Dixon on a 30-yard scoring pass to give the Hornets a 21-12 lead with four seconds in the second quarter. Glaud was 3-for-3 for 56 yards in the four-play, 57-yard drive. The touchdown was the first of Dixon's career. The Hornets added to their lead when Glaud and Zach Charles capped off a seven-play, 45-yard drive with a 10-yard touchdown pass late in the third quarter. The score gave the Hornets a 28-12 lead with 2:43 left in the third quarter. Glaud completed a 19-yard pass to Darius Jackson and Jones had a 15-yard run in the drive. The touchdown was also the first third-quarter score of the season for the Hornets. Scarlett added a 44-yard field goal to pull Morgan State to within 28-15 with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Delaware State padded its lead with its third defensive touchdown of the season. Strong safety Avery Grant returned a Carlton Jackson interception 15 yards for a touchdown to give the Hornets a 35-15 lead with 6:50 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first interception and touchdown of his career. Morgan State closed out the scoring on a nine-yard touchdown run by Jackson with 2:39 left to play. Delaware State won the total yardage battle, 281-to-258. The Hornets passed for 150 yards and rushed for 131. The Bears tallied 143 yards through the air and 115 on the ground. Darius Jackson led the Hornets with five catches for 77 yards. Dixon had three receptions for 46 yards, each a career-high. Andre Carroll had a season-high 11 tackles (3 solo) to lead the Hornet defense. Joe Mendes contributed eight tackles, including a sack. Jerome Strums had his second interception of the season for DSU.
