DSU Welcomes North Carolina A&T

Back in the thick of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title race following the team's 26-20 win at Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 11), the Hornets host the North Carolina A&T Aggies Saturday, Oct. 18 as DSU celebrates Homecoming 2008 (Carnivale). Delaware State is looking to win its fifth-straight over the Aggies and snap the team's current two-game, home-losing streak.

Delaware State enters Saturday's game looking to improve on the team's 13-3 record versus conference foes at home under **Coach Al Lavan**. The Hornets are 2-1 in conference play this season and are currently positioned behind Hampton and South Carolina State in the league standings. A win today would move DSU one step closer to catching the league leaders as the Hornets are just one game behind the Pirates and Bulldogs.

Senior quarterback **Vashon Winton** has been key for the Delaware State offense as the 6-foot-2 quarterback has accounted for all eight of the team's touchdowns on the ground. His eight rushing touchdowns so far this season are a career-best for Winton. Winton is coming off his first-career 100-yard rushing performance, registering 102 yards on the ground versus the Wildcats last Saturday. On the season, Winton has tallied 359 yards on the ground on 58 carries (6.2 yards-per-carry). Through the air, the Chicago, Ill., native has amassed 680 yards on 69-of-124 passing and three touchdowns. He is currently ranked No. 18 on the all-time MEAC passing list (4,954) and has completed 33-career touchdowns (second-most in school history).

Redshirt senior **Chris Strother** is coming off his second-career, 100-yard rushing performance, registering 110 yards versus Bethune-Cookman on Oct. 11. The Miami, Fla., product leads the team in rushing (375 yards on 73 carries) and is averaging 5.1 yards-per-carry. During the Hornet's 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman, Strother recorded a career-long 78 yard scamper to set up DSU's second touchdown of the afternoon. Strother

is averaging 75.0 yards-per-game rushing and 94.2 all-purpose yards-per-game (team best).

Senior **Eddie Brown** is averaging 12.0 yards-per-reception to lead the team. The 5-foot-10 receiver has grabbed 13 passes for 156 yards and one touchdown so far this season. Along with Brown is sophomore **Larrone Moore**, who has registered 113 receiving yards with 13 catches in 2008. The fastest athlete on the team, Moore is averaging 8.7 yards-per-reception. Junior **Zach Charles** has not only been a threat as part of the Hornet receiving corps (12 catches for 108 yards) but, he is the team's top kick returner averaging 22.5 yards-per-kickoff return.

Defensively, the Hornets rank No. 27 in the nation against the pass. Delaware State is holding opposing offenses to 172.00 yards-per-game through the air. On the ground, the opposition is averaging 175.00 yards-per-game. The Hornets are led by linebacker **Kevin Conner**. The 5-foot-11 senior has recorded 43 tackles this season. During the team's last home game (Oct. 4 vs. Hampton), Conner recovered two fumbles (the first of his career). Conner, along with defensive end **Alimayo Wilder**, led the team in total tackles last weekend (9). Wilder, a native of Baltimore, Md., disrupted the Wildcat offense as Bethune-Cookman consistently found the 6-foot-4 defensive lineman in the backfield. Wilder finished the contest with a team-high four tackles for loss. Also making impacts during the Hornet's last contest were defensive back **Avery Grant** (six tackles) and linebacker **Josh Pope** (seven tackles). Grant, who has tallied 30 tackles this season, has recorded three tackles for loss, including one sack. Pope, who has 17 tackles so far this season, has one and a-half tackles for loss, including a sack. Cornerback **Brandon Hudson** notched his second interception of the season last week, tying teammate Jerome Strums for the team lead. On the year, DSU has grabbed six interceptions.

A Quick Look at North Carolina A&T

North Carolina A&T comes into today's game having lost five-straight contests, including a 41-3 loss to Morgan State last weekend. The Bears held the Aggies to just 139 yards of offense, including 23 yards through the air as North Carolina A&T lost its second-straight conference game by more than 35 points. The Aggies are 0-2 on the road this season and have not won a road contest in over two years.

The Aggies leading passer is junior **Herb Miller**. The 6-foot-2 signal caller has completed 43-of-88 passes for 453 yards and two touchdowns this season. Sharing time behind center with Miller is Stone Mountain, Ga., product **Carlton Fears**. Fears is 26-of-60 for 205 yards and two touchdowns in '08. He is also averaging 3.7 yards-per-carry, recording 106 yards on 29 carries.

Michael Ferguson is the Aggies featured back, averaging 75.00 yards-per-game. The 5-foot-11 Ferguson has scored five touchdowns, registering 450 yards on 98 carries this year (4.6 yards-per-carry).

The top two targets for both Miller and Fears are **Giorgio Lowrance** and **Chaz Dawson**. Lowrance has caught 17 passes for 221 yards and one touchdown, averaging 13.0 yards-per-catch. Dawson has grabbed two touchdown passes, recording 219 receiving yards on 17 catches.

Linebacker **Andre Thornton** is the team's leading tackler, recording 59 tackles through seven games. Thornton has notched six tackles for loss and has recorded four pass breakups. Second on the defense in tackles is middle linebacker **Brandon Long**. The senior from Como, N.C. has tallied 50 tackles, including eight for loss this season.

Dyanmic Duo

Vashon Winton and **Chris Strother** became the first DSU tandem to rush for over 100 yards in the same game since Sept. 6, 1997 (Bryan Jenkins - 147; Clay Perry - 113 vs. Cheney). Both Winton and Strother eclipsed the century mark during Delaware State's 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 11).

Winton rushed for 102 yards on 16 carries, including two touchdowns. The 100-yard performance was the first of Winton's career.

Strother notched his second 100-yard performance of the season, gaining 110 yards on 11 carries, including a career-long 78-yard rush which led to the Hornet's second touchdown of the afternoon versus the Wildcats.

Jones' First Touchdown

Wide receiver **Erick Jones** grabbed his first-career touchdown reception during the Hornet's 26-20 win at Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 11). The 6-foot-3 Jones grabbed two receptions for 38 yards during the contest. The score came late in the second quarter and gave the Hornets a 26-10 lead.

Pair of Hornets Pick Up Weekly MEAC Honors

Senior quarterback **Vashon Winton** has been named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive Player of the Week and senior place kicker **Riley Flickinger** was named MEAC Special Teams Player of the Week for the week ending Oct. 12.

Winton rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another to lead the DSU Hornets to a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday. Winton rushed for his seventh and eighth touchdowns of the season, setting a career best for rushing touchdowns in a season (8). He recorded his first-career 100-yard rushing performance, averaging 6.4 yards-per-carry. Winton also passed for 147 yards, moving the 6-foot-2 signal caller to No. 18 all-time on the MEAC passing list (4,954). During the game, Winton connected on his 33rd-career touchdown pass.

This is Winton's fifth offensive player of the week honor of his career and seventh weekly conference honor as a Hornet (two-time MEAC Rookie of the Week). He was also named MEAC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 8).

Flickinger converted two field goal attempts to help lead the Delaware State Hornets to a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday. The Gresham, Ore., native's two field goals proved to be the difference as the Hornets snapped a three-game losing skid. Flickinger also averaged 60.2 yards-per-kickoff giving the Wildcats an average starting field position on their own 26-yard line. The 5-foot-9 senior also forced two touch backs as nearly all of his kicks reached the Wildcats goal line or sailed through the end zone.

This is Flickinger's first weekly MEAC honor.

The Field General

Senior **Vashon Winton** enters Saturday's game with a 27-11 record as the Hornets' signal caller and a 22-4 mark in MEAC contests. The Chicago, Ill., native ranks second in the school's record books in completions (454), passing attempts (802) and passing yards (4,954). His 33-career passing touchdowns are second-best on the all-time DSU list. This season, Winton has thrown three touchdowns, completing 55.6 percent of his passes en route to a 98.40 passer rating.

Mr. Opportunity

Linebacker **Kevin Conner** proved to be in the right place at the right time during the Hornet's Oct. 4 matchup with the Hampton Pirates. The 5-foot-11 Conner picked up two fumbles on the day, including one for 17 yards. His second fumble recovery resulted in the

The touchdown gave the Hornets a 14-9 lead over the Pirates. On the season, Bashir has five catches for 41 yards and one touchdown.

Home Sweet Home

During his five years as Delaware State head coach, **Al Lavan** has accumulated a record of 17-7 at Alumni Stadium. On Thursday, Sept. 4, senior quarterback **Vashon Winton** ran for four touchdowns and threw another en route to a five-touchdown performance versus the Florida A&M Rattlers. The five touchdowns in a single game set a new career mark for the 6-foot-2 quarterback. His four rushing touchdowns set a new single-game record for Winton and his lone passing touchdown moved him into a tie for the No. 2 spot all-time at Delaware State for touchdowns thrown (Dennis Jones, 1992-95).

Motivation

Defensive back **James Romain** had plenty of motivation during the Hornets contest at Kent State. Billboards and posters throughout the Ohio town depicted Romain getting beat on a touchdown reception during the team's 2007 meeting. Romain, who registered his first-career interception during that contest, made sure that last he would not be "posterized" again. Romain proved to be the Hornet's defensive MVP during this season's meeting (Sept. 13), collecting his second-career interception, breaking up two passes and tallying a team-high nine tackles.

Not a Bad Debut

Junior punter **Nick Lochner** made an impressive debut on Thursday, Sept. 4, booming seven punts for an average of 40.1 yards-per-punt, including a 61-yarder. The native of Webster, N.Y., place four punts inside the 20-yard line and two inside the 10.

Don't Mind if I Do

Redshirt junior **Jerome Strums** recorded a career-high two interceptions during DSU's 35-28 (OT) win versus Florida A&M (Sept. 4). The 6-foot free safety, picked off FAMU passers on consecutive possessions, including the game-winning pick in overtime. Both interceptions were the first of the Windsor, Conn., native's career.

11/19/94). His 139 yards also gave Strother his first-career 100-yard game, averaging 4.3 yards-per-carry.

Winton and Lochner Earn Weekly MEAC Honors

Senior quarterback **Vashon Winton** was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive Player of the Week and junior punter **Nick Lochner** was named MEAC Co-Special Teams Player of the Week for the week ending Sept. 7.

Winton accounted for five scores (four rushing, one passing) during Delaware State's 35-28 overtime victory versus Florida A&M on Thursday, Sept. 4. Winton threw for 178 yards on 21-of-33 passing, including a touchdown (a 16-yard pass to Eddie Brown) against the Rattlers. On the ground, the Chicago, Ill., native rushed for 73 yards on 14 carries, averaging 5.2 yards-per-carry. His four rushing touchdowns were a career-high.

His touchdown pass to Brown was the 31st of Winton's career, moving the 6-foot-2 signal caller into a tie for No. 2 all-time in passing touchdowns at Delaware State (Dennis Jones, 1992-95). With four rushing touchdowns versus the Rattlers, Winton's career total for running TDs moves to 19.

A Second Team Preseason All-MEAC selection, Winton combined for 251 yards of total offense versus FAMU, 63 percent of the team's total offense (398 yards). Winton's 73 yards rushing were just seven yards shy of his career best (80 yards vs. N.C. A&T - 10/14/06). Completing 63.6 percent of his passes, Winton recorded a respectable 178 yards through the air registering a passing efficiency of 106.8. Winton currently is tied for the top spot in the nation in scoring with 24.0 points-per-game. With the win, Winton improved his overall record as a starter to 26-8 and 21-3 in MEAC competition.

This was Winton's fourth offensive player of the week honor of his career and sixth weekly conference honor as a Hornet (two-time MEAC Rookie of the Week).

Lochner recorded seven punts, averaging 40.1 yards-per-punt in his Hornet debut. The Webster, N.Y., native pinned the FAMU offense deep in its own territory for most of the night, placing four punts inside the 20-yard line (two inside the 10). Lochner boomed a 61-yard punt on his first punt of the night versus the Rattlers, setting the tone for the rest of the game.

His 40.1-yard average ranks 38th in the nation. As a team, Lochner's punting average has the Hornets sitting in the Top 10 in the nation in yards-per-punt (No. 9) and first in the MEAC.

This was Lochner's first weekly MEAC honor.

Lavan Perfect in Conference Openers

Following Delaware State's 35-28 (OT) win over Florida A&M, the Hornets moved to 5-0 all-time in conference openers under **Head Coach Al Lavan**. Over the past five seasons, DSU has beaten Florida A&M four-consecutive times and downed Hampton once to open up conference play.

Coach Lavan Battles Delaware's K.C. Keeler to a Draw.... In the Kitchen

In a contest that came down to the final "pinch and dash," the head football coaches at Delaware's two Division I universities battled to a tie in the "Dover Downs Cook-off" Monday evening.

Delaware State Head Football **Coach Al Lavan** and the University of Delaware's **K.C. Keeler** showed off their culinary skills in a friendly competition to benefit the Boys & Girls Club of Delaware, and IMPACT Delaware Tobacco Prevention Coalition.

The coaches traded in their playbooks and headsets for cooking utensils and secret ingredients to see who could whip up the best "stinging Hornet chilli" and "Blue Hen chicken".

Following some pre-game instructions by Dover Downs Director of Culinary Operations Fred Bohn, Lavan and Keeler squared off to determine "First State bragging rights in the kitchen."

After tasting each man's dish, the judges gave Lavan the nod for his chilli, while Keeler got the thumbs up for his chicken.

Two New Coaches on 2008 Staff

Two new assistant coaches have joined **Al Lavan's** staff - offensive line coach **Lawrence Livingston** and running backs coach **Renato Diaz**.

► **Lawrence Livingston, Offensive Line Coach** - Livingston most recently served as an assistant under legendary head coach Mike Price at Texas-El Paso (UTEP) the past four years. He was assistant head coach and offensive line coach for the Miners. In 2005, Livingston helped lead UTEP to an 8-4 record and an appearance in the GMAC Bowl. The previous year, the Miners were 8-4 and competed in the 2004 Texas Bowl. Texas-El Paso offensive lineman Oniel Cousins was a third round draft pick of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens last spring.

During the 2001 and '02 seasons, Livingston was co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at the University of Wyoming.

In 2000, he was tight ends coach at the University of Arizona. San Diego Chargers tight end Brandon Manumaleuna played for Livingston while at Arizona.

From 1998 to '99, Livingston was running backs coach at Texas A&M. The 1998 Aggies were 11-3, captured the school's only Big 12 championship and competed against Ohio State in the Sugar Bowl. Texas A&M was 8-4 and appeared in the Alamo Bowl in 1999.

Livingston was offensive line coach at Washington State from 1995 to '97. The 1997 Cougars, led by quarterback Ryan Leif, competed in the Rose Bowl after winning the Pac-10 championship.

From 1989 to '94, Livingston was offensive line coach at Weber State in Ogden, Utah. He helped lead the Wildcats to the 1992 Division I-AA playoffs.

Livingston began his coaching career at the U.S. Military Academy in 1988, serving as offensive line coach. That year, the Cadets captured the Commander-in-Chief Trophy and received a bid to the Sun Bowl.

Livingston played college ball at Weber State, where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-time All-Big Sky Conference selection. He started every game on the offensive line during his collegiate career.

A 1986 Weber State graduate. Livingston and his wife Michelle have two sons, Lawrence Jr. (17) and Theodore (16).

► **Renato Diaz, Running Backs Coach** - Diaz, who has more than 12 years of college coaching experience, most recently served as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) rival Florida A&M the past three years.

During the 2007 season, Diaz was credited with the success of Florida A&M freshman tailback Philip Sylvester, who was named MEAC Rookie-of-the-Year after rushing for nearly 900 yards and leading the league in all-purpose yards (164.3 ypg).

Diaz began his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of South Florida (USF) in Tampa, Fla. (1996-1998), where he was an assistant to the offensive coordinator.

In 1998, Diaz was promoted to tight ends coach for USF, and also

served as coordinator for recruiting and special teams. That season, the Bulls led the nation in total punt return yards and was seventh in net punting, limiting opponents to 2.1 yards per return. During the 1999 season, South Florida was eighth in the nation in net punting and 12th in kickoff returns.

Diaz also served as running backs coach at Columbia University in New York during the 2000 season. At Columbia, Diaz coached Johnathan Reese, the school's first 1,000 yard rusher, who was an All-Ivy League First Team selection after leading the conference with 1,330 yards rushing.

From 2001 to '03, Diaz was running backs coach at Florida International University. FIU's Rashod Smith was a Division I-AA All-Independent First Team selection at running back in 2001.

In the summer of 2003, Diaz did a brief stint with the NFL's New York Jets during training camp, working with the offensive staff in all phases of preparation for the season.

Diaz was running backs coach and special teams consultant at Widener University in Chester, Pa. in 2004. That season, the Division III Pioneers were 11th in the nation in kickoff returns (23.3 ypr).

Diaz earned a bachelor's in geology from South Florida in 1983. He is also a 2005 graduate of the NCAA Advanced Coaches Academy.

Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan

Al Lavan (Colorado State '68) is in his fifth season at Delaware State University where he has guided Hornets to a 31-19 record, the 2007 MEAC title and the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA playoffs (2007). He owns a 33-20 career record which includes a 2-1 stint as interim coach at Eastern Michigan (2003). During his time at DSU, he was named the 2007 Pigskin Club of Washington D.C. MEAC Coach of the Year, FCS Region II Coach of the Year and has lead DSU to a 26-8 mark in conference play over the past four seasons.



Lavan spent two seasons as running backs coach and interim head coach at Eastern Michigan. After he took over the 1-8 team, Eastern Michigan went on to win two of its final three games of the season.

In more than 18 years as a NFL assistant, Lavan's resume' includes stints with the Atlanta Falcons, Dallas Cowboys, San Francisco 49ers, Baltimore Ravens, and the Kansas City Chiefs.

He was a member of George Seifert's 1990 Super Bowl champion San Francisco 49ers' coaching staff. That team included former Delaware State University standout John Taylor, who caught a touchdown pass in the 49ers' 55-10 win over the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXIV.

In Dallas, Lavan worked under Hall of Fame head coach Tom Landry. He helped Cowboy running backs Tony Dorsett and Herschel Walker combine for six 1000-yard seasons.

He helped lead Dallas to division titles in 1981 and '85, and wild card playoff berths in 1980 and '83.

Lavan has also served as position coach for NFL all stars Roger Craig, Priest Holmes, Tom Rathman, Ernest Byner, Robert Newhouse and Bam Morris.

Lavan's collegiate coaching tenure includes stops at Colorado State, Louisville, Iowa State, Georgia Tech, Stanford, and Washington.

He helped guide Georgia Tech to the 1978 Peach Bowl, and Washington to the 1993 Rose Bowl and 1995 Sun Bowl.

While under Lavan at Washington, Napoleon Kaufman rushed for a then-school record 1,390 yards in 1994 and had 1,851 all-purpose yards in 1993. He played seven NFL seasons before retiring in 2001.

DOVER (September 4, 2008) – Quarterback Vashon Winton rushed for a career-high four touchdowns, including the game winner in overtime, to lead defending MEAC champ Delaware State to a 35-28 win over Florida A&M (1-1, 0-1 MEAC) in the season opener for the Hornets (1-0, 1-0 MEAC) before 6,216 fans at Alumni Stadium Thursday, Sept. 4. Delaware State sealed the win when Jerome Strums intercepted Florida A&M quarterback Curtis Pulley's pass on the Rattler's first play of the overtime period. The Rattlers fell to 1-1 on the season and 0-1 in the MEAC. "We made our share of mistakes, but found a way to come out on top," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who improved to 25-7 versus MEAC opponents. "We overcame a lot of obstacles, mainly the outstanding play of Florida A&M. There's a lot of work to be done, but it's good to open the season with a win, especially against a conference opponent." Delaware State defeated Florida A&M for the fourth-straight time, its best streak in the 26-year series between the teams. Winton rushed for 78 yards on 14 carries. He also completed 21-of-32 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown. Delaware State tailback Chris Strother rushed for 139 yards on 32 carries, each a career high. "Our ability to run the ball was key to the win," added Lavan. The offensive line put forth a solid effort and Strother gave us the tough yards when we needed them." Strother started in place of Kareem Jones, Delaware State's top returning rusher, who sat out the game with a foot injury. "Hard work is the best way to describe our effort tonight," said Strother. "The offensive line created some nice holes and I tried to be patient in my approach. This was a nice way to open the season." The score was 21-21 when Winton capped off an eight-play, 57-yard drive with a four yard touchdown run with 8:17 left in the fourth quarter. The Hornets were aided by a Florida A&M pass interference penalty on a third-and-eight play at the Rattler 20. Delaware State's lead was short-lived as Florida A&M's LeRoy Vann returned the ensuing kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 28-28. Vann has returned a kickoff for a touchdown in each of the Rattler's two games. The Hornets drove 33 yards on 10 plays on the final possession of regulation, but placekicker Riley Flickinger missed a potential game-winning 47-yard field goal attempt as time expired. Delaware State appeared headed for an easy win after opening up a 14-0 first quarter lead. Winton scored the Hornets' first touchdown on a one-yard run, then he connected with Eddie Brown on a 16-yard scoring pass with 4:10 left in the opening quarter. Florida A&M began its comeback when Pulley directed the Rattlers on an eight-play, 93-yard drive. Phillip Sylvester capped off the drive with a one-yard scoring run to cut Delaware State's lead to 14-7 with 6:31 left in the second quarter. Pulley, a transfer from Kentucky, came off the bench to rush for a team-high 87 yards for the Rattlers. The Hornets took advantage of a Florida A&M turnover to regain a two touchdown lead. Four plays after Stephon Hampton recovered a muffed punt by Florida A&M Qier Hall, Winton scored on a four-yard run to give Delaware State a 21-7 lead with 3:02 left in the second quarter. Florida A&M responded with a 61-yard touchdown drive just before halftime. Eddie Battle connected with Kevin Elliot on a 10-yard touchdown pass to pull the Rattler's to within 21-14 with 28 seconds left in the half. The Rattlers tied the game at 21-21 when Pulley hit a wide open Elliot on a 34-yard "flea flicker" with 2:02 left in the third quarter. Pulley also rushed for 46 yards on four carries during the drive. Strums, who had zero career interceptions entering the contest, picked off two passes for the Hornets. There were seven turnovers in the contest, four by Florida A&M and three for Delaware State had three.

KENT, Ohio (September 13, 2008) – The Delaware State University football team failed to capitalize on several good scoring opportunities, allowing Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Kent State to claim a 24-3 victory before 8,529 fans at Dix Stadium Saturday, Sept. 13. The Golden Flashes improved to 1-2 on the season, while the Hornets fell to 1-1. The teams were meeting for the second-straight year. Kent State won last year's contest 38-7. "We made too many mistakes and Kent State deserves a great deal of credit for taking advantage of them, said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who fell to 2-3 vs. FBS opponents. "This was almost a replay of last year's game, where we gave Kent State too many chances and we failed to take advantage of our opportunities. Its tough to win when you lose the field position battle; that's what hurt us today." Delaware State forced three Kent State turnovers, including first-half interceptions by James Romain and Francis Adjei. The Hornets also recovered a second-half fumble by the Golden Flashes. The Golden Flashes took an early 7-0 lead on a 7-yard run by quarterback Julian Edelman with 9:49 left in the first quarter. The drive, which went for 62 yards on nine plays (eight on the ground) in 3:43, was kept alive on a pass interference call on third down and 19 yards to go for Kent State on its own 29-yard line. The score became 14-0 on a fake field goal by KSU which resulted in a Leneric Muldrow 31-yard touchdown run with 14:53 left in the first half. The score capped off a drive which lasted six plays for 64 yards in 1:46. Delaware State attempted to get on the board with time winding down in the second quarter. A 23-yard field goal try by Riley Flickinger with 24 seconds left in the first half was blocked, resulting in a 14-0 halftime score. It proved to be the second missed field goal of the half. Despite trailing by 14 points, the Hornets out-gained the Golden Flashes, 203-120 during the first half of action. Kent State extended its lead on a 5-yard rushing touchdown by Andre Flowers with 1:35 minutes left in the third quarter. The drive lasted nine plays for 73 yards, eating up 3:23. The Golden Flashes added three points on a 43-yard field goal by Nate Reed with 8:25 left in the game to make the score 24-0. The Hornets finally got on the board when second-string quarterback Anthony Glaud engineered a 13-play, 77-yard drive that resulted in a 23-yard field goal by Flickinger with 3:16 left to play. Glaud completed 13-of-21 passes for 159 yards, while starting signal-caller Vashon Winton connected on 11-of-18 passes for 88 yards. Winton also rushed for 44 yards on seven carries, including a career-high 39-yard scamper in the third quarter. "I had butterflies on my first series, but things settled down after that," said Glaud, a sophomore transfer from Bowling Green University. Glaud was making his first appearance for the Hornets. Chris Strother led the Hornets in rushing for the second straight game, racking up 60 yards on 11 carries. Freshman Darius Jackson had five catches for 70 yards, each a team-high. Romain was the Hornets' top tackler with nine. He was also credited with two pass break-ups. "I felt like I needed to step up today because I gave up a touchdown against these guys last year," said Romain, who has two career interceptions, each against Kent State. Edelman completed 10-of-20 passes for 113 yards, while rushing for a team-high 71 yards and a score.

DOVER (September 27, 2008) – Central Connecticut handed Delaware State its first home loss in nearly two years, 28-10, before 3,254 soggy fans at Alumni Stadium Saturday Sept. 27. The Blue Devils won their second straight to improve to 3-1 on the season, while the Hornets have lost two in a row to fall to 1-2. Delaware State had won nine straight home games since a 29-14 loss to Hampton on Sept. 28, 2006. The losing streak is also the longest for the Hornets since the '06 season. Halfback James Mallory rushed for 123 yards and a touchdown, while quarterback Hunter Wanket came off the bench to compete six-of-seven passes for 72 yards and a score to lead the Central Connecticut attack. Wanket also rushed for 99 yards on seven carries. Mallory was second among all Football Championship Subdivision players in rushing at 180.3 yards-per-game entering the contest. The Blue Devils totaled 353 yards, including 262 on the ground. Delaware State passed for 159 of its 246 total yards. The Hornets were also hurt by three turnovers, including two interceptions, and a blocked punt. "We were thoroughly beaten by a good team," said Delaware State fifth-year head coach Al Lavan, who fell to 30-18 with a Hornets and 1-1 vs. Northeast Conference opponents. "Our inability to sustain drives, hold onto the football and stop the run were all factors in the loss. We also had another special teams break down, which led to the first score of the game." Larrone Moore had six catches for 74 yards, each a career-high, to lead the Hornets. Quarterback Vashon Winton completed 14-of-26 passes for 122 yards. Winton and Chris Strother led DSU in rushing with 47 yards each. The Blue Devils used a big special teams play to get on the scoreboard first. Central Connecticut's Alondre Rush blocked a punt by Delaware State's Nick Lochner that was recovered by the Blue Devils at the Delaware State one-yard line. Two plays later, Eric Richardson scored on a one-yard plunge to give Central Connecticut a 7-0 lead with 10:20 left in the second quarter. Delaware State evened the game on its next possession. Winton capped off a six-play, 74-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown run to make it 7-7 with 7:55 left in the first half. He completed each of three passes for 44 yards and rushed for 23 yards on the scoring drive. Winton has a team-high five rushing touchdowns this season and 20 for his career. The Blue Devils wasted little time to regain the lead. Wanket entered the game on the ensuing possession, and led the Devils on a four-play, 76-yard scoring drive. Josh Vargas capped off the one-minute-42-second drive with a 15-yard run to give Central Connecticut a 14-7 lead with 6:05 remaining in the second quarter. Wanket had a 31-yard run and completed a 21-yard pass to Vargas on the drive. Central Connecticut scored its third touchdown of the second quarter when Wanket connected with Nick Colagiovanni on a 28-yard scoring pass to give the Blue Devils a 21-7 lead with 43 seconds left in the half. Delaware State got back on the board with a spark of offense right before the half. The Hornets pulled to within 21-10 when Riley Flickinger kicked a 34-yard field goal as the first half clock expired. Winton completed passes of 14 and 10 yard to Moore, and had a 19-yard run during the drive. Central Connecticut closed out the scoring when Mallory capped off a 13-play, 86 yard drive with a two-yard run with 12:39 left to play. "We played hard, but you have to give Central Connecticut a lot of credit," said Delaware State senior defensive end Alimayo Wilder. "The Blue Devils had a good game plan, and their execution was a big factor. The blocked punt was a big momentum changer in the game." Strother said the Hornets have to quickly put the loss behind them. "I give Central Connecticut a great deal of credit, but we have a lot of work to do," said Strother, who leads the Hornets with 246 yards rushing this season. "We have a lot of mistakes to clean up to get back to the type of football we are used to playing."

DOVER (October 4, 2008) – Hampton dealt a blow to Delaware State's bid for a second-consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title with a 17-14 victory over the Hornets before a Parents' Day crowd of 5,218 at Alumni Stadium. The Pirates won their third-straight game to improve to 4-1 overall and 3-0 in the MEAC. Delaware State dropped its third in a row to fall to 1-3 overall and 1-1 in league play. The loss also snapped Delaware State's nine-game winning streak in MEAC contests, and 10-game home win streak against conference foes. The defeat was DSU's first to a MEAC opponent since a 20-17 setback to Howard in the final game of the 2006 season, and the first at home to a league opponent since a 29-14 setback to Hampton on September 30, 2006. "Once again, our failure to execute was a major factor in the loss," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who fell to 25-8 in MEAC contests. "We probably had more opportunities to make big plays on offense than in the previous two games, but came up short." Hampton scored the game-winning touchdown on a 30-yard pass from Herbert Byner to Justin Brown with 3:13 left in the fourth quarter. Brown caught the pass at the Delaware State 10, then broke several attempted tackles before diving into endzone. Following the touchdown, Byner completed a two-point pass to Ralph Steward to give the Pirates a 17-14 lead. "Our defense played pretty well today, but poor tackling on our part was key on the touchdown play," Lavan said. On the ensuing possession, Delaware State drove 48 yards to the 34, but the drive ended on a fourth down incomplection with 21 seconds left. "It's disappointing that we did not execute better," said Delaware State senior quarterback Vashon Winton. "On the fourth down incomplection, I rolled out and looked for Derrick McNeil in the middle of the field, but the execution was a little off." Hampton scored first when Carlo Turavani kicked a 42-yard field goal with 12:07 left in the first quarter. The Pirates drove 78 yards to the Delaware State two-yard line, but had to settle for a 19-yard Turavani field goal to open up a 6-0 lead with 14:12 left in the second quarter. The 11-play drive was highlighted by a 41-yard pass from Byner to Jeremy Gilchrist to the Delaware State 23. Hampton took the 6-0 lead into the locker room at halftime. Delaware State's offense came alive on the opening drive of the third quarter. Winton capped off a five-play, 64-yard drive with a career-best 51-yard touchdown run to give Hornets a 7-6 lead with 11:57 left in the third quarter. Winton has a team-high six rushing touchdowns this season, and 21 for his career. Hampton regained the lead on its next possession. Turavani capped off the seven-play, 22-yard drive with a 28-yard field goal, his career-best third of the game, to give the Pirates a 9-7 lead with 7:43 left in the third quarter. The Hornets pulled ahead again early in the fourth quarter. Winton capped off a seven-play, 49-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown pass to freshman tight end Jahmel Bashir to give Delaware State a 14-9 lead with 13:39 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first touchdown reception of Bashir's career, while Winton moved into second place on the Hornets' career list with his 32nd TD pass. Hampton racked up 337 yards in the game. Byner completed 16-of-26 passes for 257 yards and a touchdown, while Brown led Hampton with seven catches for 106 yards and a score. LaMarcus Coker rushed for a team-high 69 yards for the Pirates. The Pirates were averaging 32.5 points and 379.8 yards-per-game entering the contest. Winton connected on 15-of-26 passes for 145 yards and a touchdown for Delaware State. Winton also threw two interceptions, but led all players with a career-high 93 yards rushing on 15 carries in the game. Eddie Brown and Larrone Moore led the Hornets with four catches each, although McNeil had a team-high 55 receiving yards on two receptions.

DAYOTNA BEACH, Fla. (October 11, 2008) – DSU QB Vashon Winton rushed for two touchdowns and threw another to help the Hornets break their three-game losing streak with a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman, Saturday, evening. With the victory the Hornets improve to 2-3 (2-1 in MEAC) on the season. "We had some players really step up in a much-needed win for our team," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who improved to 26-8 vs. MEAC opponents. "Winton showed a great deal of leadership directing the offense and the line really came through in a big way. I thought our defense did an outstanding job in slowing Bethune-Cookman's option attack. We showed a great deal of improvement today." The Hornets took a 3-0 lead on a 28-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger with 11:53 left in the first quarter. The field goal, Flickinger's third of the season, capped off a drive which went 46 yards on six plays in 2:58. A Delaware State special teams miscue gave Bethune-Cookman the lead later in the first quarter. A bad snap to DSU punter Nick Lochner was recovered in the endzone by the Wildcats' Ryan Davis to give BCU a 7-3 lead with 8:10 left in the opening quarter. DSU regained the lead with Vashon Winton's seventh rushing touchdown of the season on a 10-yard run with 5:07 left in the first quarter. The score tied Winton's career-best for rushing touchdowns in a single season (7). The score capped off a 70-yard drive in eight plays lasting 2:56. Bethune-Cookman tied the contest at 10-all with 0:45 left in the first quarter on a 31-yard field goal by Matt McCutcheon. The Wildcats moved 67 yards on seven plays in 4:18 to tie the ball game. Early in the second quarter Flickinger converted his second field goal of the game, registering a 20-yard attempt with 12:51 left in the half. The field goal gave DSU a 13-10 lead and kicked off a stretch of 16-straight points for the Hornets. Delaware State extended its lead to 19-10 when Winton scored his second rushing touchdown of the game from 10-yards out with 9:31 left in the first half. The Hornet could not convert the extra point due to a bad snap. The score capped a 91-yard drive on three plays in 1:19. The drive was highlighted by a career-best 78-yard rush by Chris Strother, who finished the first half with 95 yards on the ground. The Hornets found the end zone once again with a 17-yard reception by Erick Jones with 0:52 left on the clock. The reception was the first of Jones' career and extended DSU's lead to 26-10. Winton connected with Jones for his third touchdown pass of the season and 33rd of his career. The Hornets ate up 4:42 on the clock with an 11-play, 61-yard drive. Bethune-Cookman cut into Delaware State's lead with a 25-yard field goal by McCutcheon with no time on the clock as DSU went into halftime with a 26-13 lead. The Hornets out-gained the Wildcats 291-to-144 during the first half, out-rushing B-CU 158-ot-62. In the fourth quarter, DSU DB Brandon Hudson acrobatically intercepted B-CU QB McKinson Souverain's pass at the goal line, abruptly ending B-CU's drive to cut into the 13 point lead. The interception was Hudson's second this season and career. The Wildcats would get the ball back with about four minutes to go in the game. Two passes from quarterback Matthew Johnson to wide receiver Jeff Pope, including a 43-yard touchdown, would allow B-CU to get within six points at 26-20. Bethune-Cookman would try an onside kick after the touchdown, but DSU running back Kareem Jones recovered the ball. Winton guided the offense for one last first down with a little over a minute left to seal the 26-20 victory for the Hornets. The redshirt senior finished with 147 yards through the air which moves him into 18th place all-time on the MEAC career passing list. (4,954) He also finished a career-high 102 rushing yards. Strother finished with his second 100-yard rushing effort of the season (and career) as he carried the ball 11 times for 110 yards, adding to the Hornets' season-high total of 234 yards.
