**Delaware State Closes Out the 2008 Season at Howard**

The Delaware State Hornets will close out the 2008 football season, traveling to Washington, D.C., to face the Howard Bison (1-9, 0-7 MEAC) on Saturday, Nov. 22. Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00 p.m. The Hornets are coming off a 34-28 victory at Norfolk State (Nov. 15). In that contest, DSU erased a 21-point deficit to come away with the team's sixth-straight victory over the Spartans.

The Hornets (4-6, 4-3 MEAC) enter Saturday's contest ranked 83rd in total offense (315.40 yards-per-game). The Hornets improved their national ranking (91st the previous week) after racking up 371 total yards of offense versus the Spartans last week. The team also improved its rushing offense to 55th nationally (144.50), recording 195 yards on 45 carries.

Delaware State is led offensively by quarterback **Vashon Winton**, who will be making his final collegiate start on Saturday. Versus Norfolk State, Winton completed 12-of-26 passes for 176 yards and one touchdown. He also ran for another (30 yards on eight carries). The Chicago, Ill., native ranks 92 nationally and seventh in the MEAC in passing efficiency (103.18) and is seventh in the conference (74 in the nation) in total offense (173.60 yards-per-game). Winton enters Saturday's game with 1,272 yards passing on the season. He has completed 56.1 percent of his passes (128-of-228) with eight passing touchdowns in 2008. The 6-foot-2 signal caller is currently No. 12 on the MEAC's all-time passing list with 5,546 yards, second-best in school history. He has also rushed for 464 yards and a career-high 10 rushing touchdowns this season.

In the backfield, **Chris Strother** returned back to the starting lineup after missing DSU's Nov. 8 contest versus Winston-Salem State (shoulder injury). The Miami, Fla., native rushed for 81 yards on 18 carries, including an 18-yard rush to set up the game-winning touchdown last Saturday. Strother seventh in MEAC (70th in the nation) in rushing yards

(61.56 yards-per-game), tallying a team-high 554 yards on 113 attempts this season. Joining Storther in the DSU backfield is senior **Kareem Jones**. Jones rattled off 71 yards on 16 carries versus the Spartans before leaving the game with an ankle injury. On the year, Jones has compiled 407 yards on 82 carries with two touchdowns, averaging 5.0 yards-per-carry.

Senior **Eddie Brown** leads a DSU receiving corps which has registered 1,709 yards on 166 receptions, including nine touchdowns. Brown is 13th in the MEAC in receptions per game, averaging 2.90 receptions-per-game. Brown has recorded 29 catches for 318 yards and two touchdowns. Junior **Larrone Moore** is second on the team in receptions, catching 28 passes for 285 yards and one touchdown. Moore is also a threat in the return game, averaging 21.8 yards-per-kickoff return. Versus Norfolk State (Nov. 15), Moore rattled off 99 yards on three returns, including a 60 yarder which sparked DSU's comeback.

On the defensive side of the ball, Delaware State has a squad that ranks 18th in the nation in total defense (301.20 yards-per-game allowed). Linebacker **Kevin Conner** leads all Hornet defenders with 85 total tackles (32 solo) this season. Conner is third in the MEAC in tackles-per-game (8.50). He has three tackles for loss in 2008 and leads the team with three fumble recoveries. Joining Conner at linebacker is senior **Jackie Watkins**. Third on the team in total tackles (56), Watkins has recorded seven tackles for loss, including two sacks. The defensive line is anchored by senior tackle **Ronn Spinner, Jr.** The Lorton, Va., native has 40 tackles, including four and one-half for loss. **Akiel Russell** and **Andre Carroll** have also been a force on the D-line, each recording 38 tackles on the season.

Defensive back **Avery Grant** leads the 11th-ranked passing defense in the nation. Grant is second on the team in total tackles (67), recording a team-high eight and one-half tackles for loss in 2008. **James Romain**, **Jerome Strums** and **Brandon Hudson** are each tied for the team lead in interceptions (3). Romain comes into Saturday's game with 40 total tackles and a team-high 10 pass breakups. Strums has 33 total tackles and one forced fumble, while Hudson has notched six tackles this season.

On special teams, **Nick Lochner** has made the most of his first season at DSU. Lochner is averaging 39.7 yards-per-punt, booming nine punts of 50+ yards and place 18 punts inside the 20-yard line.

## A Quick Look at Howard

The Howard Bison close out what can be summed up as a rough season, entering Saturday's game with a 1-9 record (0-7 MEAC). Despite the one-win season, Howard has played some hard-fought battles, dropping four of its nine total losses by five points or less. The Bison enter Saturday's game riding a six-game losing streak and are still looking for their first home victory of the season.

Howard is led by quarterback **Floyd Haigler**, who has thrown 16 touchdown passes this season. Haigler enters Saturday's game with 2,336 yards on 237-of-412 passing in '08. Averaging 233.6 yards passing-per-game Haigler has registered a 110.20 passer rating through 10 games.

On the ground, the Bison are led by **Karlos Whittaker**, who has rushed for 386 yards on 109 carries. Whittaker has notched a team-high four rushing touchdowns so far this season.

Wide receiver **Arlandus Hood** leads all Bison with 53 catches and 510 yards, including one touchdown. **Willie Carter** has grabbed a team-best six receiving touchdowns in 2008. Carter is averaging 79.5 yards receiving-per-game (44 catches, 477 yards).

Howard's defense is led by 2008 MEAC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year honoree **Endor Cooper**. Cooper has recorded 116 total tackles this season, including 14 and one-half tackles for loss and two sacks. He has forced four fumbles.

### Offense Continues to Climb

For the second-straight week, the Delaware State Hornets' offense improved its national ranking from the previous week. With 371 total yards of offense (195 on the ground; 176 through the air), DSU improved its national ranking in total offense from 91st to 83rd.

### A Tale of Two Halves

After falling behind 28-7 and allowing 216 total yards of offense, the Delaware State defensive unit buckled down and shut down the Norfolk State offense. The Hornets shut out the Spartans and held NSU to just 67 yards of total offense in the second half.

### No. 4 Ranks No. 5

The performance put forth by running back **Kareem Jones** on Saturday, Nov. 8 versus Winston-Salem State, placed the senior in the DSU record books. Rushing for a career-high 230 yards on 35 carries, Jones eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark (1,041). His 230 yards rushing was the fifth-best performance by a DSU running back in school history. He also tied Michael Murray (10/5/91 vs. Jackson State) for the second-most carries by a back in a single game.

### Three Through the Air

Although quarterback **Vashon Winton** has found a lot of success, finding the end zone on the ground this season (9 rushing touchdowns), the Chicago, Ill., native registered three passing touchdowns versus the Winston-Salem State Rams on Nov. 8. The three touchdowns were the most by Winton since his sophomore year. That year Winton completed four touchdown passes during DSU's 63-28 win over St. Francis (Pa.) on Sept. 9, 2006.

### Romain Picks Off Two

Senior James Romain registered a career-high two interceptions during his final home game at Alumni Stadium (Nov. 8 vs. Winston-Salem State). The 5-foot-11 Romain, intercepted passes on consecutive possessions during the Hornets 26-27 loss, giving the defensive back three interceptions for the season. He becomes the second DSU defensive back to have multiple-interception games. (Jerome Strums vs. FAMU - Spet. 4)

### The Track Star Finds the End Zone

Junior **Larrone Moore** is known for his speed. In fact the 6-foot Moore is a member of the DSU track team. On Saturday, Nov. 8, Moore registered his first-career touchdown reception catching a 14-yard pass from **Vashon Winton**. For the game, Moore caught four passes for 73 yards and one touchdown, including a 45 yard reception in which Moore used his track speed to out run Ram defenders before being knocked out-of-bounds.

### Jones Earns MEAC Offensive Player of the Week Honors

Running back **Kareem Jones** has been named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Offensive Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 9

Jones registered a career-high 230 yards rushing on 35 carries versus Winston-Salem State on Saturday. Averaging 6.6 yards-per-carry, Jones notched the fifth-highest rushing total in DSU history. His 35 carries are tied for second most in the Delaware State record books. Jones also tallied two receptions for 13 yards and one touchdown. With his 230 yards, Jones surpassed the 1,000-yard mark, with 1,049 yards rushing during his DSU career.

This is Jones' first player of the week honor.

### McNeil Returns Strong

After missing the previous two games due to injury, wide receiver **Derrick McNeil** recorded a career-high eight catches for 48 yards during DSU's 23-17 loss to South Carolina State (Nov. 1). On the year, McNeil has 24 catches for 206 yards, averaging 29.4 yards-per-game.

### Not Afraid to Throw It

The Delaware State Hornets recorded a season-high in both completions (31) and passing attempts (44) during DSU's 23-17 loss to South Carolina State (Nov. 1). During that contest quarterback **Vashon Winton** recorded both season-highs in completions 23 and at-

### A Little Trickery

During the Saturday, Nov. 1 contest versus South Carolina State, Delaware State used a formation not seen this season. Both **Vashon Winton** and **Anthony Glaud** were on the field at the same time, resulting in a 20-yard completion from Glaud to Winton. The reception was the first of Winton's career at DSU.

### Lochner Continues to Impress

Punter **Nick Lochner** booted a career-best 64-yard punt during Delaware State's 23-17 loss to South Carolina State (Nov. 1). The Webster, N.Y., native notched two kicks of 50+ yards during that contest to give the first-year punter 11 kicks of 50+ yards on the year. Lochner's previous career-best was 61 yards (done twice this season). On the season, Lochner has punted 46 times for 1826 yards (39.7 yards-per-punt), placing 19 punts inside the 20-yard line.

### Grant Earns First POW Honor

Defensive back **Avery Grant** was named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Defensive Player of the Week for the week ending Nov. 2.

Grant registered a career-high 14 tackles during DSU's 23-17 loss to South Carolina State. The Brooklyn, N.Y., native notched seven solo tackles and seven assisted tackles, including one and one-half for a loss. He also forced and recovered a fumble, giving DSU a chance to drive for a game-winning touchdown. On the year, Grant has 61 total tackles (second on the team) with six and one-half tackles for loss, including two sacks.

This was Grant's first player of the week honor.

### Winton in the MEAC Record Books

With **Vashon Winton's** 12-of-26 passing performance for 176 yards versus the Norfolk State Spartans, the Chicago, Ill., native is currently ranked No. 13 on the MEAC's career passing leaders list. Winton has compiled 5,546 yards through the air on 513-of-906 passing during his four seasons with DSU. The 6-foot-2 quarterback is 46 yards shy of passing Bethune-Cookman's Todd Walker ('94-'97) for No. 12. He became just the 17th player in MEAC history to record at least 5,000 yards passing.

### Lone Bright Spot

There was not much for the Hornets to be happy about following the 20-3 loss at Morgan State on Oct. 25. However, junior **Nick Lochner** recorded career-highs in punts (8) and yardage (330). Lochner finished the game averaging 41.2 yards-per-punt (his third-best, single-game total of the season). The Webster, N.Y., native also boomed a 58-yard punt during that contest. Three of his eight punts went for 50 yards or more. Three of his eight punts also landed inside the 20-yard line. On the season Lochner is averaging 39.7 yards-per-punt and ranks No. 47 in the nation in punting. The 6-foot-1 punter has registered nine punts of 50 yards or more and has placed 19 of his 46 total punts inside the 20-yard line.

## Dynamic Duo - Part Two

During Delaware State's 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T (Oct. 18) the quarterback tandem of Vashon Winton and Anthony Glaud each threw for over 100 yards. Winton completed 10-of-17 passing for 110 yards, while Glaud notched 165 yards, completing 8-of-9 through the air versus the Aggies. This marked the first time in over 20 years at DSU that two quarterbacks threw for over 100 yards in the same game.

## Sharing the Wealth

During the Hornet's 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T, five different Delaware State players found the end zone. **Jaashawn Jones, Chris Strother, Kareem Jones, Vashon Winton** and **Eddie Brown** all scored touchdowns during the contest. It was the first time five-or-more Hornets scored at least one touchdown in a single game since DSU's 62-0 win over Concordia (W.Va.) on Nov. 4, 2006.

## Firsts A Plenty

Not only did five different Hornets find the end zone during DSU's 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T but, three of those touchdowns were firsts of the season. **Jaashawn Jones, Chris Strother** and **Kareem Jones** each notched their first touchdowns of the 2008 season during that contest.

## A Lopsided Contest

Delaware State registered its most lopsided victory in nearly two years with the team's 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T (Oct. 18). Prior to that victory, the Hornets shut out Concordia (W.Va.), 62-0, on Nov. 4, 2006. The Hornets not only tilted the scoreboard on Saturday, Oct. 18, they out-gained the Aggies 423-195 in total offense, 275-115 in passing yards and 148-80 in rushing. The 423 total yards of offense and the 275 yards passing were season highs for DSU.

## Glaud Gets First Touchdown

During Delaware State's 42-7 win over the North Carolina A&T Aggies, redshirt sophomore **Anthony Glaud** recorded his first-career touchdown pass, connecting with wide receiver **Eddie Brown** for 59 yards. Glaud finished the contest with 165 yards on 8-of-9 passing.

## Extra Points Add Up

Place kicker **Riley Flickinger** went a perfect 6-for-6 on extra point attempts versus the North Carolina A&T Aggies on Saturday, Oct. 18. The Gresham, Ore., native converted all six extra points attempts to help DSU to a 42-7 victory. On the season, Flickinger is 23-of-24 on point after attempts.

## Glaud Named MEAC Rookie of the Week

Quarterback **Anthony Glaud** has been named the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Rookie of the Week for the week ending Oct. 19.

Glaud completed 8-of-9 passing for 165 yards and one touchdown during Delaware State's 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T on Saturday. Glaud registered his first-career touchdown pass at DSU with a 59-yard completion to wide receiver Eddie Brown. Glaud was a key component in Delaware State's season high 275 yards through the air on 18-of-26 passing. The Sicklerville, N.J., native has recorded 437 yards on 38-of-57 passing, including one touchdown and a passer rating of 126.33 in seven contests this season. This was Glaud's first player of the week honor.

## Dyanmic Duo

**Vashon Winton** and **Chris Strother** became the first DSU tandem to rush for over 100 yards in the same game since Sept. 6, 1997 (Bryan Jenkins - 147; Clay Perry - 113 vs. Cheney). Both Winton and Strother eclipsed the century mark during Delaware State's 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 11).

Winton rushed for 102 yards on 16 carries, including two touchdowns. The 100-yard performance was the first of Winton's career.

Strother notched his second 100-yard performance of the season, gaining 110 yards on 11 carries, including a career-long 78-yard rush which led to the Hornet's second touchdown of the afternoon versus the Wildcats.

## Jones' First Touchdown

Wide receiver **Erick Jones** grabbed his first-career touchdown reception during the Hornet's 26-20 win at Bethune-Cookman (Oct. 11). The 6-foot-3 Jones grabbed two receptions for 38 yards during the contest. The score came late in the second quarter and gave the Hornets a 26-10 lead.

Winton rushed for two touchdowns and threw for another to lead the DSU Hornets to a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday, Oct. 11. Winton rushed for his seventh and eighth touchdowns of the season, setting a career best for rushing touchdowns in a season (8). He recorded his first-career 100-yard rushing performance, averaging 6.4 yards-per-carry. Winton also passed for 147 yards, moving the 6-foot-2 signal caller to No. 18 all-time on the MEAC passing list (4,954). During the game, Winton connected on his 33rd-career touchdown pass.

This is Winton's fifth offensive player of the week honor of his career and seventh weekly conference honor as a Hornet (two-time MEAC Rookie of the Week). He was also named MEAC Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 8).

Flickinger converted two field goal attempts to help lead the Delaware State Hornets to a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman on Saturday. The Gresham, Ore., native's two field goals proved to be the difference as the Hornets snapped a three-game losing skid. Flickinger also averaged 60.2 yards-per-kickoff giving the Wildcats an average starting field position on their own 26-yard line. The 5-foot-9 senior also forced two touch backs as nearly all of his kicks reached the Wildcats goal line or sailed through the end zone.

This is Flickinger's first weekly MEAC honor.

### The Field General

Senior **Vashon Winton** enters Saturday's game with a 28-13 record as the Hornets' signal caller and a 24-6 mark in MEAC contests. The Chicago, Ill., native ranks second in the school's record books in completions (513), passing attempts (906) and passing yards (5,546). His

38-career passing touchdowns are second-best on the all-time DSU list. This season, Winton has thrown seven touchdowns, completing 56.1 percent of his passes en route to a 103.18 passer rating.

### Mr. Opportunity

Linebacker **Kevin Conner** proved to be in the right place at the right time during the Hornet's Oct. 4 matchup with the Hampton Pirates. The 5-foot-11 Conner picked up two fumbles on the day, including one for 17 yards. His second fumble recovery resulted in the Hornet's go-ahead touchdown early in the fourth quarter. The fumble recoveries were the first of his career. Conner has tallied 76 tackles (three for loss) and three fumble recoveries on the season.

### The First of Many

On Saturday, Oct. 4, freshman tight end **Jahmel Bashir** hauled in his first-career touchdown with a six-yard reception from **Vashon Winton** with 13:39 left in the game. The touchdown gave the Hornets a 14-9 lead over the Pirates. On the season, Bashir has seven catches for 49 yards and one touchdown.

### Moore Sets Career Mark

Sophomore wide receiver Larrone Moore notched a career-high six catches for 74 yards during DSU's loss to Central Connecticut State (Sept. 27). His previous career-best was a four-catch, 46-yard outing versus Howard on Nov. 17, 2007. Moore has recorded 28 catches for 285 yards and one touchdown in nine games this season.

### Carroll Makes His Presence Felt

Redshirt sophomore Andre Carroll registered a team-high 12 tackles versus Central Connecticut State (Sept. 27). The 12 tackles not only led the team, they proved to be a career-high for the Neptune, N.J., native. Previously, Carroll recorded just one tackle in four appearances during the 2007 season. This season, Carroll has recorded 38 tackles in 10 games played.

### Motivation

Defensive back **James Romain** had plenty of motivation during the Hornets contest at Kent State. Billboards and posters throughout the Ohio town depicted Romain getting beat on a touchdown reception during the team's 2007 meeting. Romain, who registered his first-career interception during that contest, made sure that last he would not be "posterized" again. Romain proved to be the Hornet's defensive MVP during this season's meeting (Sept. 13), collecting his second-career interception, breaking up two passes and tallying a team-high nine tackles.

### Winton Finds the End Zone Again and Again and Again...

On Thursday, Sept. 4, senior quarterback **Vashon Winton** ran for four touchdowns and threw another en route to a five-touchdown performance versus the Florida A&M Rattlers. The five touchdowns in a single game set a new career mark for the 6-foot-2 quarterback. His four rushing touchdowns set a new single-game record for Winton and his lone passing touchdown moved him into a tie for the No. 2 spot all-time at Delaware State for touchdowns thrown (Dennis Jones, 1992-95).

### Not a Bad Debut

Junior punter **Nick Lochner** made an impressive debut on Thursday, Sept. 4, booming seven punts for an average of 40.1 yards-per-punt, including a 61-yarder. The native of Webster, N.Y., place four punts inside the 20-yard line and two inside the 10.

### Don't Mind if I Do

Redshirt junior **Jerome Strums** recorded a career-high two interceptions during DSU's 35-28 (OT) win versus Florida A&M (Sept. 4). The 6-foot free safety, picked off FAMU passers on consecutive possessions, including the game-winning pick in overtime. Both interceptions were the first of the Windsor, Conn., native's career.

### Catch Me If You Can

Running Back **Chris Strother** had a banner night versus the Florida

A&M Rattlers on Thursday, Sept. 4, registering a career-high 139 yards on 32 carries. He also grabbed four passes for 31 yards. In all, the Miami, Fla., native compiled 170 all-purpose yards on the night. His 32 carries tied the third-most all-time by a Delaware State Hornet (Fabian Thorne, 11/19/94). His 139 yards also gave Strother his first-career 100-yard game, averaging 4.3 yards-per-carry.

ing the 6-foot-2 signal caller into a tie for No. 2 all-time in passing touchdowns at Delaware State (Dennis Jones, 1992-95). With four rushing touchdowns versus the Rattlers, Winton's career total for running TDs moved to 19.

A Second Team Preseason All-MEAC selection, Winton combined for 251 yards of total offense versus FAMU, 63 percent of the team's total offense (398 yards). Winton's 73 yards rushing were just seven yards shy of his career best (80 yards vs. N.C. A&T - 10/14/06). Completing 63.6 percent of his passes, Winton recorded a respectable 178 yards through the air registering a passing efficiency of 106.8. Winton currently is tied for the top spot in the nation in scoring with 24.0 points-per-game. With the win, Winton improved his overall record as a starter to 26-8 and 21-3 in MEAC competition.

This was Winton's fourth offensive player of the week honor of his career and sixth weekly conference honor as a Hornet (two-time MEAC Rookie of the Week).

Lochner recorded seven punts, averaging 40.1 yards-per-punt in his Hornet debut. The Webster, N.Y., native pinned the FAMU offense deep in its own territory for most of the night, placing four punts inside the 20-yard line (two inside the 10). Lochner boomed a 61-yard punt on his first punt of the night versus the Rattlers, setting the tone for the rest of the game.

His 40.1-yard average ranks 38th in the nation. As a team, Lochner's punting average has the Hornets sitting in the Top 10 in the nation in yards-per-punt (No. 9) and first in the MEAC.

This was Lochner's first weekly MEAC honor.

### **Lavan Perfect in Conference Openers**

Following Delaware State's 35-28 (OT) win over Florida A&M, the Hornets moved to 5-0 all-time in conference openers under **Head Coach Al Lavan**. Over the past five seasons, DSU has beaten Florida A&M four consecutive times and downed Hampton once to open up conference play.

### **Coach Lavan Battles Delaware's K.C. Keeler to a Draw.... In the Kitchen**

In a contest that came down to the final "pinch and dash," the head football coaches at Delaware's two Division I universities battled to a tie in the "Dover Downs Cook-off" Monday evening.

### **Two New Coaches on 2008 Staff**

Two new assistant coaches have joined **Al Lavan's** staff - offensive line coach **Lawrence Livingston** and running backs coach **Renato Diaz**.

► **Lawrence Livingston, Offensive Line Coach** - Livingston most recently served as an assistant under legendary head coach Mike Price at Texas-El Paso (UTEP) the past four years. He was assistant head coach and offensive line coach for the Miners. In 2005, Livingston helped lead UTEP to an 8-4 record and an appearance in the GMAC Bowl. The previous year, the Miners were 8-4 and competed in the 2004 Texas Bowl. Texas-El Paso offensive lineman Oniel Cousins was a third round draft pick of the NFL's Baltimore Ravens last spring.

During the 2001 and '02 seasons, Livingston was co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at the University of Wyoming.

In 2000, he was tight ends coach at the University of Arizona. San Diego Chargers tight end Brandon Manumaleuna played for Livingston while at Arizona.

From 1998 to '99, Livingston was running backs coach at Texas A&M. The 1998 Aggies were 11-3, captured the school's only Big 12 championship and competed against Ohio State in the Sugar Bowl. Texas A&M was 8-4 and appeared in the Alamo Bowl in 1999.

Livingston was offensive line coach at Washington State from 1995 to '97. The 1997 Cougars, led by quarterback Ryan Leif, competed in the Rose Bowl after winning the Pac-10 championship.

From 1989 to '94, Livingston was offensive line coach at Weber State in Ogden, Utah. He helped lead the Wildcats to the 1992 Division I-AA playoffs.

Livingston began his coaching career at the U.S. Military Academy in 1988, serving as offensive line coach. That year, the Cadets captured the Commander-In-Chief Trophy and received a bid to the Sun Bowl

Livingston played college ball at Weber State, where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-time All-Big Sky Conference selection. He started every game on the offensive line during his collegiate career.

A 1986 Weber State graduate. Livingston and his wife Michelle have two sons, Lawrence Jr. (17) and Theodore (16).

► **Renato Diaz, Running Backs Coach** - Diaz, who has more than 12 years of college coaching experience, most recently served as running backs coach and recruiting coordinator at Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) rival Florida A&M the past three years.

During the 2007 season, Diaz was credited with the success of Florida A&M freshman tailback Philip Sylvester, who was named MEAC

Rookie-of-the-Year after rushing for nearly 900 yards and leading the league in all-purpose yards (164.3 ypg).

Diaz began his coaching career at his alma mater, the University of South Florida (USF) in Tampa, Fla. (1996-1998), where he was an assistant to the offensive coordinator.

In 1998, Diaz was promoted to tight ends coach for USF, and also served as coordinator for recruiting and special teams. That season, the Bulls led the nation in total punt return yards and was seventh in net punting, limiting opponents to 2.1 yards per return. During the 1999 season, South Florida was eighth in the nation in net punting and 12th in kickoff returns.

Diaz also served as running backs coach at Columbia University in New York during the 2000 season. At Columbia, Diaz coached Johnathan Reese, the school's first 1,000 yard rusher, who was an All-Ivy League First Team selection after leading the conference with 1,330 yards rushing.

From 2001 to '03, Diaz was running backs coach at Florida International University. FIU's Rashod Smith was a Division I-AA All-Independent First Team selection at running back in 2001.

In the summer of 2003, Diaz did a brief stint with the NFL's New York Jets during training camp, working with the offensive staff in all phases of preparation for the season.

Diaz was running backs coach and special teams consultant at Widener University in Chester, Pa. in 2004. That season, the Division III Pioneers were 11th in the nation in kickoff returns (23.3 ypr).

Diaz earned a bachelor's in geology from South Florida in 1983. He is also a 2005 graduate of the NCAA Advanced Coaches Academy.

# - NCAA FCS Playoffs

## Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan

Al Lavan (Colorado State '68) is in his fifth season at Delaware State University where he has guided Hornets to a 33-22 record, the 2007 MEAC title and the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA playoffs (2007). He owns a 35-23 career record which includes a 2-1 stint as interim coach at Eastern Michigan (2003). During his time at DSU, he was named the 2007 Pigskin Club of Washington D.C. MEAC Coach of the Year, FCS Region II Coach of the Year and has lead DSU to a 28-10 mark in conference play over the past four seasons.



Lavan spent two seasons as running backs coach and interim head coach at Eastern Michigan. After he took over the 1-8 team, Eastern Michigan went on to win two of its final three games of the season.

In more than 18 years as a NFL assistant, Lavan's resume' includes stints with the Atlanta Falcons, Dallas Cowboys, San Francisco 49ers, Baltimore Ravens, and the Kansas City Chiefs.

He was a member of George Seifert's 1990 Super Bowl champion San Francisco 49ers' coaching staff. That team included former Delaware State University standout John Taylor, who caught a touchdown pass in the 49ers' 55-10 win over the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXIV.

In Dallas, Lavan worked under Hall of Fame head coach Tom Landry. He helped Cowboy running backs Tony Dorsett and Herschel Walker combine for six 1000-yard seasons.

He helped lead Dallas to division titles in 1981 and '85, and wild card playoff berths in 1980 and '83.

Lavan has also served as position coach for NFL all stars Roger Craig, Priest Holmes, Tom Rathman, Ernest Byner, Robert Newhouse and Bam Morris.

Lavan's collegiate coaching tenure includes stops at Colorado State, Louisville, Iowa State, Georgia Tech, Stanford, and Washington.

He helped guide Georgia Tech to the 1978 Peach Bowl, and Washington to the 1993 Rose Bowl and 1995 Sun Bowl.

While under Lavan at Washington, Napoleon Kaufman rushed for a then-school record 1,390 yards in 1994 and had 1,851 all-purpose yards in 1993. He played seven NFL seasons before retiring in 2001.

DOVER (September 4, 2008) – Quarterback Vashon Winton rushed for a career-high four touchdowns, including the game winner in overtime, to lead defending MEAC champ Delaware State to a 35-28 win over Florida A&M (1-1, 0-1 MEAC) in the season opener for the Hornets (1-0, 1-0 MEAC) before 6,216 fans at Alumni Stadium Thursday, Sept. 4. Delaware State sealed the win when Jerome Strums intercepted Florida A&M quarterback Curtis Pulley's pass on the Rattler's first play of the overtime period. The Rattlers fell to 1-1 on the season and 0-1 in the MEAC. "We made our share of mistakes, but found a way to come out on top," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who improved to 25-7 versus MEAC opponents. "We overcame a lot of obstacles, mainly the outstanding play of Florida A&M. There's a lot of work to be done, but it's good to open the season with a win, especially against a conference opponent." Delaware State defeated Florida A&M for the fourth-straight time, its best streak in the 26-year series between the teams. Winton rushed for 78 yards on 14 carries. He also completed 21-of-32 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown. Delaware State tailback Chris Strother rushed for 139 yards on 32 carries, each a career high. "Our ability to run the ball was key to the win," added Lavan. The offensive line put forth a solid effort and Strother gave us the tough yards when we needed them." Strother started in place of Kareem Jones, Delaware State's top returning rusher, who sat out the game with a foot injury. "Hard work is the best way to describe our effort tonight," said Strother. "The offensive line created some nice holes and I tried to be patient in my approach. This was a nice way to open the season." The score was 21-21 when Winton capped off an eight-play, 57-yard drive with a four yard touchdown run with 8:17 left in the fourth quarter. The Hornets were aided by a Florida A&M pass interference penalty on a third-and-eight play at the Rattler 20. Delaware State's lead was short-lived as Florida A&M's LeRoy Vann returned the ensuing kickoff 80 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 28-28. Vann has returned a kickoff for a touchdown in each of the Rattler's two games. The Hornets drove 33 yards on 10 plays on the final possession of regulation, but placekicker Riley Flickinger missed a potential game-winning 47-yard field goal attempt as time expired. Delaware State appeared headed for an easy win after opening up a 14-0 first quarter lead. Winton scored the Hornets' first touchdown on a one-yard run, then he connected with Eddie Brown on a 16-yard scoring pass with 4:10 left in the opening quarter. Florida A&M began its comeback when Pulley directed the Rattlers on an eight-play, 93-yard drive. Phillip Sylvester capped off the drive with a one-yard scoring run to cut Delaware State's lead to 14-7 with 6:31 left in the second quarter. Pulley, a transfer from Kentucky, came off the bench to rush for a team-high 87 yards for the Rattlers. The Hornets took advantage of a Florida A&M turnover to regain a two touchdown lead. Four plays after Stephon Hampton recovered a muffed punt by Florida A&M Qier Hall, Winton scored on a four-yard run to give Delaware State a 21-7 lead with 3:02 left in the second quarter. Florida A&M responded with a 61-yard touchdown drive just before halftime. Eddie Battle connected with Kevin Elliot on a 10-yard touchdown pass to pull the Rattler's to within 21-14 with 28 seconds left in the half. The Rattlers tied the game at 21-21 when Pulley hit a wide open Elliot on a 34-yard "flea flicker" with 2:02 left in the third quarter. Pulley also rushed for 46 yards on four carries during the drive. Strums, who had zero career interceptions entering the contest, picked off two passes for the Hornets. There were seven turnovers in the contest, four by Florida A&M and three for Delaware State had three.

KENT, Ohio (September 13, 2008) – The Delaware State University football team failed to capitalize on several good scoring opportunities, allowing Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Kent State to claim a 24-3 victory before 8,529 fans at Dix Stadium Saturday, Sept. 13. The Golden Flashes improved to 1-2 on the season, while the Hornets fell to 1-1. The teams were meeting for the second-straight year. Kent State won last year's contest 38-7. "We made too many mistakes and Kent State deserves a great deal of credit for taking advantage of them, said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who fell to 2-3 vs. FBS opponents. "This was almost a replay of last year's game, where we gave Kent State too many chances and we failed to take advantage of our opportunities. Its tough to win when you lose the field position battle; that's what hurt us today." Delaware State forced three Kent State turnovers, including first-half interceptions by James Romain and Francis Adjei. The Hornets also recovered a second-half fumble by the Golden Flashes. The Golden Flashes took an early 7-0 lead on a 7-yard run by quarterback Julian Edelman with 9:49 left in the first quarter. The drive, which went for 62 yards on nine plays (eight on the ground) in 3:43, was kept alive on a pass interference call on third down and 19 yards to go for Kent State on its own 29-yard line. The score became 14-0 on a fake field goal by KSU which resulted in a Leneric Muldrow 31-yard touchdown run with 14:53 left in the first half. The score capped off a drive which lasted six plays for 64 yards in 1:46. Delaware State attempted to get on the board with time winding down in the second quarter. A 23-yard field goal try by Riley Flickinger with 24 seconds left in the first half was blocked, resulting in a 14-0 halftime score. It proved to be the second missed field goal of the half. Despite trailing by 14 points, the Hornets out-gained the Golden Flashes, 203-120 during the first half of action. Kent State extended its lead on a 5-yard rushing touchdown by Andre Flowers with 1:35 minutes left in the third quarter. The drive lasted nine plays for 73 yards, eating up 3:23. The Golden Flashes added three points on a 43-yard field goal by Nate Reed with 8:25 left in the game to make the score 24-0. The Hornets finally got on the board when second-string quarterback Anthony Glaud engineered a 13-play, 77-yard drive that resulted in a 23-yard field goal by Flickinger with 3:16 left to play. Glaud completed 13-of-21 passes for 159 yards, while starting signal-caller Vashon Winton connected on 11-of-18 passes for 88 yards. Winton also rushed for 44 yards on seven carries, including a career-high 39-yard scamper in the third quarter. "I had butterflies on my first series, but things settled down after that," said Glaud, a sophomore transfer from Bowling Green University. Glaud was making his first appearance for the Hornets. Chris Strother led the Hornets in rushing for the second straight game, racking up 60 yards on 11 carries. Freshman Darius Jackson had five catches for 70 yards, each a team-high. Romain was the Hornets' top tackler with nine. He was also credited with two pass break-ups. "I felt like I needed to step up today because I gave up a touchdown against these guys last year," said Romain, who has two career interceptions, each against Kent State. Edelman completed 10-of-20 passes for 113 yards, while rushing for a team-high 71 yards and a score.

DOVER (September 27, 2008) – Central Connecticut handed Delaware State its first home loss in nearly two years, 28-10, before 3,254 soggy fans at Alumni Stadium Saturday Sept. 27. The Blue Devils won their second straight to improve to 3-1 on the season, while the Hornets have lost two in a row to fall to 1-2. Delaware State had won nine straight home games since a 29-14 loss to Hampton on Sept. 28, 2006. The losing streak is also the longest for the Hornets since the '06 season. Halfback James Mallory rushed for 123 yards and a touchdown, while quarterback Hunter Wanket came off the bench to compete six-of-seven passes for 72 yards and a score to lead the Central Connecticut attack. Wanket also rushed for 99 yards on seven carries. Mallory was second among all Football Championship Subdivision players in rushing at 180.3 yards-per-game entering the contest. The Blue Devils totaled 353 yards, including 262 on the ground. Delaware State passed for 159 of its 246 total yards. The Hornets were also hurt by three turnovers, including two interceptions, and a blocked punt. "We were thoroughly beaten by a good team," said Delaware State fifth-year head coach Al Lavan, who fell to 30-18 with a Hornets and 1-1 vs. Northeast Conference opponents. "Our inability to sustain drives, hold onto the football and stop the run were all factors in the loss. We also had another special teams break down, which led to the first score of the game." Larrone Moore had six catches for 74 yards, each a career-high, to lead the Hornets. Quarterback Vashon Winton completed 14-of-26 passes for 122 yards. Winton and Chris Strother led DSU in rushing with 47 yards each. The Blue Devils used a big special teams play to get on the scoreboard first. Central Connecticut's Alondre Rush blocked a punt by Delaware State's Nick Lochner that was recovered by the Blue Devils at the Delaware State one-yard line. Two plays later, Eric Richardson scored on a one-yard plunge to give Central Connecticut a 7-0 lead with 10:20 left in the second quarter. Delaware State evened the game on its next possession. Winton capped off a six-play, 74-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown run to make it 7-7 with 7:55 left in the first half. He completed each of three passes for 44 yards and rushed for 23 yards on the scoring drive. Winton has a team-high five rushing touchdowns this season and 20 for his career. The Blue Devils wasted little time to regain the lead. Wanket entered the game on the ensuing possession, and led the Devils on a four-play, 76-yard scoring drive. Josh Vargas capped off the one-minute-42-second drive with a 15-yard run to give Central Connecticut a 14-7 lead with 6:05 remaining in the second quarter. Wanket had a 31-yard run and completed a 21-yard pass to Vargas on the drive. Central Connecticut scored its third touchdown of the second quarter when Wanket connected with Nick Colagiovanni on a 28-yard scoring pass to give the Blue Devils a 21-7 lead with 43 seconds left in the half. Delaware State got back on the board with a spark of offense right before the half. The Hornets pulled to within 21-10 when Riley Flickinger kicked a 34-yard field goal as the first half clock expired. Winton completed passes of 14 and 10 yard to Moore, and had a 19-yard run during the drive. Central Connecticut closed out the scoring when Mallory capped off a 13-play, 86 yard drive with a two-yard run with 12:39 left to play. "We played hard, but you have to give Central Connecticut a lot of credit," said Delaware State senior defensive end Alimayo Wilder. "The Blue Devils had a good game plan, and their execution was a big factor. The blocked punt was a big momentum changer in the game." Strother said the Hornets have to quickly put the loss behind them. "I give Central Connecticut a great deal of credit, but we have a lot of work to do," said Strother, who leads the Hornets with 246 yards rushing this season. "We have a lot of mistakes to clean up to get back to the type of football we are used to playing."

DOVER (October 4, 2008) – Hampton dealt a blow to Delaware State's bid for a second-consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title with a 17-14 victory over the Hornets before a Parents' Day crowd of 5,218 at Alumni Stadium. The Pirates won their third-straight game to improve to 4-1 overall and 3-0 in the MEAC. Delaware State dropped its third in a row to fall to 1-3 overall and 1-1 in league play. The loss also snapped Delaware State's nine-game winning streak in MEAC contests, and 10-game home win streak against conference foes. The defeat was DSU's first to a MEAC opponent since a 20-17 setback to Howard in the final game of the 2006 season, and the first at home to a league opponent since a 29-14 setback to Hampton on September 30, 2006. "Once again, our failure to execute was a major factor in the loss," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who fell to 25-8 in MEAC contests. "We probably had more opportunities to make big plays on offense than in the previous two games, but came up short." Hampton scored the game-winning touchdown on a 30-yard pass from Herbert Bynes to Justin Brown with 3:13 left in the fourth quarter. Brown caught the pass at the Delaware State 10, then broke several attempted tackles before diving into endzone. Following the touchdown, Bynes completed a two-point pass to Ralph Steward to give the Pirates a 17-14 lead. "Our defense played pretty well today, but poor tackling on our part was key on the touchdown play," Lavan said. On the ensuing possession, Delaware State drove 48 yards to the 34, but the drive ended on a fourth down incomplection with 21 seconds left. "It's disappointing that we did not execute better," said Delaware State senior quarterback Vashon Winton. "On the fourth down incomplection, I rolled out and looked for Derrick McNeil in the middle of the field, but the execution was a little off." Hampton scored first when Carlo Turavani kicked a 42-yard field goal with 12:07 left in the first quarter. The Pirates drove 78 yards to the Delaware State two-yard line, but had to settle for a 19-yard Turavani field goal to open up a 6-0 lead with 14:12 left in the second quarter. The 11-play drive was highlighted by a 41-yard pass from Bynes to Jeremy Gilchrist to the Delaware State 23. Hampton took the 6-0 lead into the locker room at halftime. Delaware State's offense came alive on the opening drive of the third quarter. Winton capped off a five-play, 64-yard drive with a career-best 51-yard touchdown run to give Hornets a 7-6 lead with 11:57 left in the third quarter. Winton has a team-high six rushing touchdowns this season, and 21 for his career. Hampton regained the lead on its next possession. Turavani capped off the seven-play, 22-yard drive with a 28-yard field goal, his career-best third of the game, to give the Pirates a 9-7 lead with 7:43 left in the third quarter. The Hornets pulled ahead again early in the fourth quarter. Winton capped off a seven-play, 49-yard drive with a six-yard touchdown pass to freshman tight end Jahmel Bashir to give Delaware State a 14-9 lead with 13:39 left in the fourth quarter. It was the first touchdown reception of Bashir's career, while Winton moved into second place on the Hornets' career list with his 32nd TD pass. Hampton racked up 337 yards in the game. Bynes completed 16-of-26 passes for 257 yards and a touchdown, while Brown led Hampton with seven catches for 106 yards and a score. LaMarcus Coker rushed for a team-high 69 yards for the Pirates. The Pirates were averaging 32.5 points and 379.8 yards-per-game entering the contest. Winton connected on 15-of-26 passes for 145 yards and a touchdown for Delaware State. Winton also threw two interceptions, but led all players with a career-high 93 yards rushing on 15 carries in the game. Eddie Brown and Larrone Moore led the Hornets with four catches each, although McNeil had a team-high 55 receiving yards on two receptions.

DAYOTNA BEACH, Fla. (October 11, 2008) – DSU QB Vashon Winton rushed for two touchdowns and threw another to help the Hornets break their three-game losing streak with a 26-20 win over Bethune-Cookman, Saturday, evening. With the victory the Hornets improve to 2-3 (2-1 in MEAC) on the season. "We had some players really step up in a much-needed win for our team," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who improved to 26-8 vs. MEAC opponents. "Winton showed a great deal of leadership directing the offense and the line really came through in a big way. I thought our defense did an outstanding job in slowing Bethune-Cookman's option attack. We showed a great deal of improvement today." The Hornets took a 3-0 lead on a 28-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger with 11:53 left in the first quarter. The field goal, Flickinger's third of the season, capped off a drive which went 46 yards on six plays in 2:58. A Delaware State special teams miscue gave Bethune-Cookman the lead later in the first quarter. A bad snap to DSU punter Nick Lochner was recovered in the endzone by the Wildcats' Ryan Davis to give BCU a 7-3 lead with 8:10 left in the opening quarter. DSU regained the lead with Vashon Winton's seventh rushing touchdown of the season on a 10-yard run with 5:07 left in the first quarter. The score tied Winton's career-best for rushing touchdowns in a single season (7). The score capped off a 70-yard drive in eight plays lasting 2:56. Bethune-Cookman tied the contest at 10-all with 0:45 left in the first quarter on a 31-yard field goal by Matt McCutcheon. The Wildcats moved 67 yards on seven plays in 4:18 to tie the ball game. Early in the second quarter Flickinger converted his second field goal of the game, registering a 20-yard attempt with 12:51 left in the half. The field goal gave DSU a 13-10 lead and kicked off a stretch of 16-straight points for the Hornets. Delaware State extended its lead to 19-10 when Winton scored his second rushing touchdown of the game from 10-yards out with 9:31 left in the first half. The Hornet could not convert the extra point due to a bad snap. The score capped a 91-yard drive on three plays in 1:19. The drive was highlighted by a career-best 78-yard rush by Chris Strother, who finished the first half with 95 yards on the ground. The Hornets found the end zone once again with a 17-yard reception by Erick Jones with 0:52 left on the clock. The reception was the first of Jones' career and extended DSU's lead to 26-10. Winton connected with Jones for his third touchdown pass of the season and 33rd of his career. The Hornets ate up 4:42 on the clock with an 11-play, 61-yard drive. Bethune-Cookman cut into Delaware State's lead with a 25-yard field goal by McCutcheon with no time on the clock as DSU went into halftime with a 26-13 lead. The Hornets out-gained the Wildcats 291-to-144 during the first half, out-rushing B-CU 158-ot-62. In the fourth quarter, DSU DB Brandon Hudson acrobatically intercepted B-CU QB McKinson Souverain's pass at the goal line, abruptly ending B-CU's drive to cut into the 13 point lead. The interception was Hudson's second this season and career. The Wildcats would get the ball back with about four minutes to go in the game. Two passes from quarterback Matthew Johnson to wide receiver Jeff Pope, including a 43-yard touchdown, would allow B-CU to get within six points at 26-20. Bethune-Cookman would try an onside kick after the touchdown, but DSU running back Kareem Jones recovered the ball. Winton guided the offense for one last first down with a little over a minute left to seal the 26-20 victory for the Hornets. The redshirt senior finished with 147 yards through the air which moves him into 18th place all-time on the MEAC career passing list. (4,954) He also finished a career-high 102 rushing yards. Strother finished with his second 100-yard rushing effort of the season (and career) as he carried the ball 11 times for 110 yards, adding to the Hornets' season-high total of 234 yards.

DOVER (October 18, 2008) – Delaware State racked up a season-high 423 total yards in a 42-7 win over North Carolina A&T before 6,089 Homecoming fans at Alumni Stadium. The Hornets won their second straight to improve to 3-3 overall and 3-1 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The Aggies have lost their last six games to fall to 2-6 and 0-4 in the MEAC. Delaware State also won its fifth in a row over the Aggies to open up a 19-18 lead in the series. The Hornets have outscored NCA&T 69-7 in their last two meetings. The Hornets' point total and margin of victory were the most since a 62-0 win over Concord (W. Va.) in 2006. "We played well at times, and not so well in others, but it was a fine win for our team," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan, who improved to 5-0 vs. NCA&T and 26-8 vs. MEAC opponents. "I thought we squandered some good scoring chances in the first half, but our defense played well enough to keep the Aggies off the board until late in the game." Delaware State opened the scoring when redshirt freshman Jaashawn Jones capped off a six-play, 39-yard drive with his first career touchdown on a one-yard plunge on the game's opening drive. NCA&T failed to recover an onside kick to begin the contest, giving the Hornets excellent field position on the opening possession. DSU again took advantage of a short field for its second score. An eight-yard punt by the Aggies' Lee Woodson gave Delaware State the ball on the NCA&T 30 six minutes into the game. Four plays later, Chris Strother scored his second touchdown of the season on a 19-yard run to give the Hornets a 14-0 lead with 8:03 left in the first quarter. The Delaware State defense set-up the Hornets next touchdown. Two plays after linebacker Josh Pope forced and recovered a fumble at the NCA&T 26, Kareem Jones scored his first touchdown of the season on a four-yard run to give DSU a 21-0 lead with 13:15 left in the second quarter. The Hornets were aided by a pass interference call on the Aggies during the drive. Despite committing a turnover on each of its next three second-quarter possessions, Delaware State maintained its three-touchdown lead at the half. "The turnovers kept up from taking a bigger lead at the half," Lavan said. "I stressed the need to be more efficient on offense during the halftime break." Delaware State put together a long drive for the only score in the third quarter. Quarterback Vashon Winton capped off a 10-play, 70-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run to give the Hornets a 28-0 lead with 6:29 left in the third quarter. Winton leads the Hornets with nine rushing touchdowns this season, and has 24 for his career. He also completed three-of-four passes for 41 yards, while Strother rushed for 27 yards on five carries during the drive. The Hornets scored on the first play of the fourth quarter to open up a five-touchdown lead. Kareem Jones scored his second touchdown of the game on a seven-yard run to cap off a six-play, 76-yard drive, directed by second-string quarterback Anthony Glaud. Glaud, a sophomore transfer from Bowling Green University, completed three-of-three passes for 53 yards during the drive. Delaware State opened up a 42-0 lead after the game's only passing touchdown. Glaud connected with Eddie Brown on a 59-yard scoring pass with 12:50 left in the fourth quarter. It was Glaud's first touchdown pass at Delaware State, and Brown's second scoring catch of the season. Brown had four receptions for a career-high 88 yards, topping all players. DSU's Darius Jackson hauled in four passes for a career-high 74 yards. North Carolina A&T avoided being shutout when Nigel Tomlin scored on an eight-yard touchdown run with 8:55 remaining in the game. Strother led all players with 79 yards rushing on 13 carries. The Hornets passed for a season-high 275 yards in the contest. Glaud completed eight-of-nine passes for a season-high 165 yards, while Winton was 10-for-17 for 110 yards. Seven players had at least one catch for the Hornets. Delaware State's defense held the Aggies to 80 yards rushing and 195 total yards. The Hornets had a season-high six sacks, including two by Joe Mendes. Brandon Hudson had his team-leading third interception, while Donta Herrod picked off his first career pass for DSU.

BALTIMORE, Md. (October 25, 2008) – Four turnovers, resulting in 17 points proved to be the difference as the Delaware State Hornets fell to the Morgan State Bears, 20-3, on Saturday, Oct. 25 at Hughes Stadium. Held to a season-low 118 yards on the day the Hornets (3-4, 3-2 MEAC) suffered their second MEAC loss of the season. The win improves Morgan State's record to 5-3, 3-1 MEAC. "The thing that happened in this game is what we predicted would happen between these two types of teams," said Head Coach Al Lavan. "The team that created the most turnovers would win the game. We are pretty much a ball-control team and to turn the ball over four times really affected us today. The defense for the most part played pretty darn good, despite giving up a play here and there. You're not going to play much better versus that caliber of running back (Devan James) and offensive line. We were not able to overcome the turnovers and to couple that with the fact that we seldom made a significant play on offense resulted in Morgan State winning the field position battle." The Hornets rushed for 87 yards on 30 carries and threw for 31 yards. Quarterbacks Vashon Winton and Anthony Glaud combined for 5-of-15 passing, including three interceptions. On the ground, Vashon led all DSU players with 44 yards on 15 carries. Defensively, DSU held Morgan State to 200 yards of total offense (second-best defensive production of the season for Delaware State). The Hornets limited James below his conference-leading 125 yards rushing-per-game to just 103 yards on the ground. James scored both of MSU's touchdowns on 26 carries. Linebacker Jackie Watkins led the way on defense for the Hornets tallying a career-high 12 tackles on the afternoon. The Woodbridge, Va., native also notched his second sack of the season, recording three tackles for loss versus the Bears. "I wouldn't say that they (Morgan State) got the best of us," said Watkins. "We just didn't execute and make the tackles when we needed to. That escalated to big plays and they capitalized on that. We felt like we were doing a pretty good job on defense, containing James. We were taking away his cutback lanes." On the team's opening drive, the Hornets got on the board to take an early lead. Winton used his feet to get the Hornets into the red zone, rushing for 34 yards. The drive was halted by a Morgan State pass deflection on third down, allowing kicker Riley Flickinger to cap off the nine-play, 40-yard drive with a 35-yard field goal that put Delaware State ahead, 3-0. Morgan State responded. Late in the first quarter, MSU linebacker Troy Leftwich intercepted a Winton pass to give the Bears the ball at the DSU 27-yard line. The interception resulted in the Bear's first touchdown of the afternoon. James scampered 26 yards down to the one-yard line where he would stumble into the end zone two plays later to give the Bears the 7-3 lead. MSU extended its lead with a 27-yard field goal by James Meade. The score was set up following a fumbled punt by Delaware State's Zacharri Charles. The DSU wide receiver miss-played a Johnathan Skeete punt, giving Morgan State the ball at the Delaware State 17-yard line. The Hornets headed into the locker room, trailing 10-3 at half. Morgan State held a slight edge in yardage heading into halftime, 79-73. After a scoreless third quarter, Meade added his second field goal of the contest, connecting from 27 yards out to give the Bears a 13-3 lead. After receiving great field position following a short punt by Nick Lochner, the Bears drove 36 yards on eight plays to set up the field goal attempt. Despite the 32-yard punt by Lochner, the Webster, N.Y., native finished the day averaging 41.2 yards-per-punt on a career-best eight punts, including a long of 58 yards and placing three punts inside the 20-yard line. Morgan State scored their second touchdown of the game on a five-yard scamper by James to give the Bears a 20-3 lead, capping off a five-play, 33-yard drive, lasting 2:52. The drive was set up by the third interception of the game committed by DSU. Cornerback Darren Mckhan picked off a pass from Glaud at the Delaware State 33-yard line with seven minutes remaining in the game. Unable to muster a comeback, Delaware State fell to the Bears for the first time since 2004.

DOVER (November 1, 2008) – Delaware State nearly overcame a 20-point deficit before falling to South Carolina State 23-17 at Alumni Stadium. The first-place Bulldogs won their fifth-straight game to improve to 7-2 overall and 5-0 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC). The Hornets lost their second in a row to fall to 3-5 and 3-3. The loss eliminated Delaware State, the defending MEAC champ, from winning 2008 conference title outright. South Carolina State led by 20 points after Travil Jamison's one-yard touchdown run with 5:00 left in the third quarter. Delaware State scored 14 unanswered points to pull to within 23-17, but failed to complete the comeback when its final possession ended in South Carolina State territory in the closing moments of the game. "It's tough to come back after falling behind by three touchdowns against a team like South Carolina State," said Delaware State head coach Al Lavan, who fell to 27-8 vs. MEAC opponents. "I was proud of the way we fought back, but South Carolina State came up with some big plays down the stretch." South Carolina State scored first when quarterback Malcolm Long connected with tight end Octavius Darby on a seven-yard touchdown pass on the game's opening drive to give the Bulldogs a 6-0 lead. Delaware State blocked the extra-point attempt. The score capped off a nine-play, 70-yard drive. A Delaware State turnover resulted in South Carolina State's second score. Four plays after South Carolina State recovered a fumble by Delaware State punt returner Chris Strother at the DSU 17, Blake Erickson hit a 31-yard field goal to give the Bulldogs a 9-0 lead with 9:26 left in the second quarter. The Hornets responded with a 13-play, 54-yard drive, but had to settle for a 30-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger to pull to within 9-3 with 3:43 left in the first half. Quarterback Vashon Winton completed five-of-seven passes for 46 yards during the drive. Long and Darby connected on a 48-yard scoring pass on a third-down and-11 play to give the Bulldogs a two-touchdown lead late in the second quarter. The extra point kick by Erickson gave South Carolina State a 16-3 lead with 1:59 left in the half. Darby had four catches for a game-high 97 yards and two touchdowns. Long completed 18-of-30 passes for 246 yards and two scores. Jamison's touchdown run capped off a five-play, 41-yard drive, and gave the Bulldogs a 23-3 lead with 5:00 minutes left in the third quarter. The big play in the drive was a 21-yard completion on third-and-11 from Long to wide receiver Phillip Morris to the Delaware State eight-yard-line. Delaware State used a trick play to score its first touchdown in two games. A 20-yard completion from second-string quarterback Anthony Glaud to Winton gave Delaware State the ball at the Bulldog eight-yard line. Glaud was lined-up as a running back on the second-and-14 play. The reception was the first of Winton's career. Winton capped off the 10-play, 64-yard drive with an 11-yard touchdown pass to Eric Jones to pull the Hornets to within 23-10 with 52 seconds left in the third quarter. The Hornets capitalized on South Carolina State's first turnover of the game to pull closer. Three plays after an interception and 26-yard return by Jerome Strums gave Delaware State the ball at the South Carolina State 11, Jaashawn Jones reached the end zone on a three-yard run to cut the Bulldogs' lead to 23-17 with 8:44 left to play. South Carolina State answered with a seven-play, 48-yard drive, but running back William Ford lost a fumble to the Hornets at the DSU 18-yard line with 4:31 left to play. The Hornets held Ford, the MEAC's second-leading rusher, to 70-yards on 19 carries. Ford was averaging nearly 122-yards-per-game entering the contest. Delaware State gained 34 yards to the SC State 48 on the ensuing possession, but the drive ended on a fourth down incomplete pass with 1:27 remaining. South Carolina State outgained the Hornets 364-to-229 in total yardage. The Hornets netted just nine yards rushing. Delaware State's Derrick McNeil had a career-high eight catches (48 yards) to lead all players. Nine players had at least one catch for the Hornets.

DOVER (November 8, 2008) – Winston-Salem State scored the game-winning touchdown with less than five minutes to play, then stopped Delaware State on fourth down and a foot on the Hornets' final possession in a 27-26 victory at Alumni Stadium Saturday afternoon. The Rams won their second in a row to improve to 3-6 on the season, while the Hornets fell to 3-6 after dropping their third straight. Winston-Salem State trailed 26-14 before outscoring DSU 13-0 over the last 21 minutes of the game. The Rams trailed 26-21 before quarterback Jarrett Dunston capped off a 12-play, 56-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown plunge on fourth-down to give WSSU a 27-26 lead with 4:19 left to play. A two-point pass following the touchdown was unsuccessful. On the ensuing possession, Delaware State drove 52 yards to the Rams' 20-yard line. The drive was aided by a pass interference call on Winston-Salem State with the Hornets facing a third-down-22 on their 16-yard line. Kareem Jones also had a 29-yard run during the drive. Delaware State faced a fourth-down and less-than-a-yard at the Winston-Salem 20 with 38 seconds left, but Vashon Winton was stopped short on a quarterback keeper up the middle, setting off a celebration on the Rams' sideline. "This was a tale of two halves," said Delaware State Head Coach Al Lavan. "We played well in the first half, but I give Winston-Salem credit for making the big plays down the stretch. The game came down to one yard, but we came up short." "We were hoping to draw Winston offside on the fourth-down play, but I thought we could pick up the yardage on a keeper," said Winton, who completed 13-of-21 passes for 145 yards and a season-high three touchdowns. "It just didn't work out the way we were hoping." Delaware State opened the scoring on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Winston to Kareem Jones on the game's first possession. The big play in the drive was a 45-yard pass from Winton to Larrone Moore to the Winston-Salem 19. Jones also rushed for 21 yards during the drive, part of his career-best 230 yards in the game, the fifth-highest total in team history. "It was nice to have a big game, but it's tough when it comes in a losing effort," said Jones, who surpassed 1,000 yards at DSU during the contest. "I give credit to the offensive line, which made it all happen for me." Winston-Salem scored 14 unanswered points, including touchdown runs by Willie Wilson (four yards) and Dunston (eight yards) to open up a 14-7 lead in the first quarter. A 27-yard field goal by Riley Flickinger and a safety on a bad punt snap by the Rams pulled Delaware State to within 14-12 with 9:49 left in the second quarter. The Hornets regained the lead when Winton connected with Eric Jones on a nine-yard touchdown pass with 6:33 left in the second quarter. The extra point by Flickinger gave DSU a 19-14 lead. Delaware State stretched its lead to 26-14 when Winton and Moore teamed up on a 14-yard scoring pass with 32 second left in the first half. Winston-Salem State pulled to within 26-21 on a nine-yard touchdown run by Nicholas Copper with 6:10 left in the third quarter.

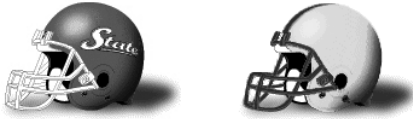

NORFOLK, Va. (November 15, 2008) – For the second-straight season, the Delaware State Hornets (4-6, 4-3 in MEAC) came from behind to beat the Norfolk State Spartans (4-7, 3-5 in MEAC), 34-28. DSU scored 27 unanswered points for the sixth-straight win over NSU. A one-yard touchdown run by Jaashawn Jones with 26.2 seconds left in the game sealed the Hornet's victory and maintained Head Coach Al Lavan's perfect record versus the Spartans (5-0). "I am extremely proud of the way our guys fought today," said Head Coach Al Lavan. "They showed the heart of a champion. The key to today's game was that our kids never gave in to adversity. This game had a lot of ebb and flow. There were good and bad points of the game but, our guys kept fighting." Quarterback Vashon Winton finished the day with 176 yards through the air and a touchdown. The running back duties were split between seniors Chris Strother (18 carries for 81 yards) and Kareem Jones (16 carries for 71 yards) who both added big runs when the team needed it. Strother carried the entire load during the tail end of the third quarter and all of the fourth, after K. Jones suffered an ankle injury. The game-winning drive, in which Strother accounted for 30 yards on four carries, including an 18-yard run down to the two-yard line with time winding down, went for 58 yards on five plays and ate up three minutes and 17 seconds. The Hornets took their first lead of the contest, scoring 28-unanswered points with J. Jones' third-career touchdown. The go-ahead score was set up defensive back Francis Adjei's second intercepted pass of the season, picking off NSU's Dennis Brown and returning the ball to the Delaware State 42-yard line. The interception came with 5:02 left in the game with the score knotted at 28-all. The DSU defense, which allowed 216 yards of total offense in the first half, held the Spartans to just 67 yard during the second half, including the squad's only turnover of the game (Adjei's pick). In the first half, Norfolk State jumped out all over Delaware State, taking advantage of some key turnovers, resulting in great field position. Norfolk State found the end zone late in the opening quarter as Brown hit wide receiver Jamar Johnson on the run for a seven-yard touchdown and the 7-0 lead. Brown scrambled for 51 yards to set up the Spartans' first red zone opportunity of the game. The scoring drive lasted 10 plays for 90 yards in 5:10. The Spartans were handed their second scoring opportunity of the contest early in the second quarter as cornerback Don Carey picked up a John Newman fumble and took it 49 yards for the touchdown and a 14-0 lead. DSU capitalized on its first red zone possession of the game as Winton scrambled for a 12-yard touchdown to cut the Spartan lead in half at 14-7. The Chicago, Ill., native's 10th rushing touchdown of the season was set up by a botched sideside kick and a 16-yard reception by wide receiver Erick Jones. The redshirt junior leads the team with three touchdown receptions on the season. E. Jones' receptions capped off a five-play, 45-yard drive lasting 1:56. The Spartans recaptured their 14-point lead (21-7) on a nine-play, 57-yard drive late in the second quarter. Brown rushed through the middle for a 16-yard touchdown. The rush was preceded by an 18-yard reception by freshman wide receiver P.J. Hayden deep in DSU territory. With 00:41 left in the first half, Norfolk State extended the lead to 28-7 right when Brown lofted a pass to the right side of the end zone where Johnson caught his second touchdown pass of the game. Carey's fifth interception of the season allowed the Spartans to start the drive on the Hornets' 32 yard-line. DSU kicker Riley Flickinger concluded the first half with a 21-yard field goal to cut the NSU lead to 28-10 as time expired. Wide receiver Larrone Moore's 60-yard kickoff return gave the Hornets a starting position right outside the Spartan red zone. Winton then completed a 17-yard pass to Eddie Brown to set up field goal attempt for the junior from Gresham, Ore. The Hornets started the scoring in the second half when Winton completed a 21-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Darius Jackson, the first of his young career. Winton engineered a drive that lasted seven plays and covered 67 yards in 3:05 and was highlighted by a 22-yard run by K. Jones down to the Spartan 20 yard-line. The score cut NSU's lead to 28-17 with 8:55 left in the third quarter. DSU converted a fake field goal with 14:50 left in the game when Brandon Hudson took the snap and rushed for a 12-yard touchdown run down the left side of the field. The Hornets converted the two-point conversion on a quarterback keeper by Winton to cut Norfolk State's lead to three at 28-25. With Flickinger's second field goal of the afternoon, the Hornets tied the game, 28-28, with 5:08 to go in the contest. Winton's 18-yard pass to Jackson, and a 10-yard run by Strother allowed Flickinger to connect from 32 yards out.
